Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

"*Come on*!" says Jesus, urging a pair of his earliest disciples to walk with him as they journey on the path of God's kingdom. "Walking" in Judaism was understood as how one conducted one's day by day life – one walked the pathway toward righteousness and peace – one followed God's way.

Those who follow Jesus – do not always possess certainty – we walk by faith, placing our confidence in him who is our light. Our assurance is that if we walk with Jesus, we will experience God's presence moving alongside us as we go forward step-by-step. We find ourselves in line with the psalmist's voicing: *"even though I walk through the valley and shadow of death, I fear no evil; for You (O, God) are with me."* (Psalm 23:4)

One of the students in my Tuesday evening class brought a hymn to sing at the classes beginning. He shared how much this hymn transformed his life and the community he served. The people in his church ask for this hymn almost every week. For a moment, I wondered, what could this hymn possible be? – Then, he revealed, it is a spiritual.

> "I want Jesus to walk with me, I want Jesus to walk with me, All along my pilgrim journey, Lord, I want Jesus to walk with me.

In my trials...Lord, walk with me, etc."

We listened to a young woman's voice mesmerize us as she voiced the deep longings of a community wearied with anguish and pain at life's injustices. Then we joined in singing, and in the midst of our singing, we were transported, we became aware that simply by voicing our desire to have Jesus walk with us, Jesus became present. There is wonder, joy, and amazement when we are able to catch glimpses of God in Christ Jesus "walking" alongside us.

The gospel of Micah, the prophet, reminds us as a new voice enters into the dialogue we'll hear in this coming Sunday's First Reading:

"With what shall I come before the Lord?" -Micah 6:6 -- 1st voice

*"He (God, the Lord) has told you, o mortal, what is good; and, what does the Lord require of you; but, to do justice. love kindness, and walk humbly with your God." -Micah 6:8 – 3<sup>rd</sup> voice* 

The whole of our life is meant to be oriented towards God and God's way of living. This is hope for us – and brings us joy. Don't let the flummoxing patterns of the unjust, discourage you in seeking truth , loving kindness, and walking God's way.
