


TLCB Assistance - Annual Report 2019

This year had a devastating start. We lost both Rosie Wheatley and MacAlan Thompson after the annual meeting last year. Rosie's quilts have been a huge part of our fundraising and Mac was the point man in Laos. We plan to continue the quilt auction to be known as Rosie's Quilt Auction, have some leads on quilters. Vaughn Smith has taken up the reins in Laos and is doing a outstanding job.

Since the last annual business meeting, your contributions funded five projects in Laos, totaling \$16,117.00. In Thailand, we provided \$6,699.00 in student assistance. Details of the motions are in the quarterly reports available on the forum.

In Laos, we have continued the refurbishing of dilapidated/needy schools. As we have done from the beginning, TLCB provides the supplies and the parents and school staff supply the labor. You can see some of the results on the TLCB Facebook page.

We currently have 11 college/university students in the Student Assistance program. We had two university students graduate in May and the two remaining high school students are now in university. The Student Assistance Program is still on schedule to sunset by 2024.
