### COMMUNICATIONS

The nascent TLC Brotherhood (TLCB) began in 1997 when a handful of veterans who shared similar military backgrounds met via the Internet. As our organization grew, with members widely scattered about the U.S. and the world, our daily TLCB communications have continued to be primarily Internet based.

Email list servers soon replaced the private email lists maintained by individual members, which better facilitated easy, effective electronic communication. An Internet web site was set up to advertise our existence and solicit new members. Additionally, we began publishing a quarterly newsletter, "The Mekong Express Mail" (MEM) with stories, interviews, and announcements of interest to the general membership. Our Exchange is now web based too.

As technology has advanced, so has our organization. With a completely revamped web site, communications now take place daily in various forums on the site, replacing the older technology of email servers. Discussions range from our wartime experiences to what is going on in our personal lives today. You too can share in the warm camaraderie of this brotherhood. TLCB wants YOU!
