COMMUNICATIONS

The nascent TLC Brotherhood (TLCB) began in 1997 when a handful of veterans, who shared similar military backgrounds, met via the Internet. As our organization grew, with members widely scattered about the USA and the world, our daily TLCB communications have continued to be primarily Internet based.

We maintain a website to advertise our existence, solicit new members and allow for dues payment and donations. It gives easy access to reunion information, submitted photos and stories, board of directors officer information, and our Exchange. The Exchange offers very popular logo items such as “Secret War” *base* hats, shirts, mugs, patches, pins, challenge coins, etc.

We publish a full-color quarterly newsletter, “The Mekong Express Mail” containing “war” stories, member profiles, memories of Southeast Asia and the war, and official announcements.

We officially sanction a Facebook page and an Internet forum to share in the warm camaraderie of this brotherhood. TLCB wants YOU!
