WILLIAM ROSS JOHNSTON SCHOLARSHIP

The SASNC names one of its scholarships the "William Ross Johnston Scholarship" in memory and honor of William Ross Johnston who was a member of SASNC at his death in 1988. Mr. Johnston included the St. Andrew's Society as a beneficiary in his will. His substantial bequest is the largest single gift ever received by the SASNC. His generosity is the primary reason the society has its endowment fund which provides (along with yearly member contributions) support for our charitable grants and scholarships.

Other smaller planned gifts have been made over the years to the endowment fund by lifetime gifts or bequests from an estate plan.


