

TERRY SMITH APPRECIATION

For 20 years Terry Carter Smith has served as executive secretary of the SASNC. Previously she was an assistant at Pinehurst Surgical Clinic to Drs. Pat Henderson and John Monroe. When Dr. Monroe, a founding member, became Society president in 2002 he stated he would carry on if Terry Smith was brought on as his assistant. Terry became the bedrock of the Society through 10 presidents and dozens of board members. She was always a gracious, informed and helpful expediter for hundreds of members. Our successful dinners, board meetings, financial records and correspondence was assured by Terry. She was the welcoming voice of SASNC on thousands of telephone calls and emails.

Mrs. Smith was traveling during our recent dinner at the GMHG and did not desire a large recognition occasion. On June 16 at Theo's Tavern in Pinehurst Terry was presented with a Ben Owens III pottery sculpture by President Robert Boykin and President-elect James Graham. Her husband Julian, a retired educator, and past presidents Daniel Pate and Donald McLeod were present.

AYR MOUNT BRICK REPOINTING

William Kirkland, born in Ayr Scotland, bought 500 acres near Hillsborough, NC in 1799 and built Ayr Mount circa 1815. Mount Ayr is one of several restored homes in the Classical American Homes Preservation Trust. The Trust was founded by Richard Jenrette, a native of Raleigh, graduate of UNC Chapel Hill and founder of Lufkin and Jenrette, Inc. The New York Times described him as "the last gentleman on Wall Street".

Ayr Mount is a federal-era plantation house and, for a home in the Trust, it has a rather simple and even austere appearance on the outside. The interior is very elegant with 14-foot ceilings, and elaborate wood and plasterwork throughout. Public tours are available but check for schedule.

LOCH LOMOND: HIGH ROAD OR LOW ROAD NEXT TRIP TO SCOTLAND?

Although one of Scotland's most famous songs, the high road and the low road of Loch Lomond are puzzling to most. Prior to the Jacobite defeat in 1746 at the Battle of Culloden, many Scottish soldiers were imprisoned in Carlisle Castle near the Scottish border. "Loch Lomond" tells the story of two such Jacobites, one to be executed (the voice in the song) and one released. The high road is the real ethnic highway via Loch Lomond to the Highlands. The low road is the soul or spirit road for those dying in foreign lands. The melancholic song provokes an emotional response even to those ignorant of its history.

By yon bonnie banks and by yon bonnie braes, Where the sun shines bright on Loch Lomond, Where me & my true love were ever wont to gae, On the bonnie, bonnie banks o' Loch Lomond.
