DEDICATION OF CAPE FEAR SCOTTISH IMMIGRATION MEMORIAL

Mark your calendar! After six years of fundraising and bureaucratic maneuvers, the Cape Fear Scottish Memorial has been completed. Almost 300 years ago Highland Scots began immigrating into the Cape Fear region while Scots-Irish came down the Great Wagon Trail from Pennsylvania into Piedmont and western NC. This permanent memorial stands as a tribute to their courage, resilience, and lasting contributions to the history and development of NC and the nation.

The dedication will be November 14, 2025, at 2:00 p.m. at Brunswick Town/Fort Anderson State Historic Site below Wilmington.
