

PUPPY ADOPTION APPLICATION

The Service Dog Connection has a handful of litters each year. Dogs being bred are carefully selected based on health and temperament to achieve high percentages of service dog candidates. All puppies are temperament tested to determine which pups are best for service dog work, therapy dog work, or pet homes. Those not suited for service work are then made available to be adopted into therapy dog or pet homes. When our program ends up with more service dog candidates than we have puppy raisers for, some of these service dog candidates also become available to other service dog programs and homes of people wanting to train their own service dog.

All parents of our litters are PennHip, OFA Elbow, OFA Cardiac, OFA Eye & Genetic tested. All puppies are raised with early neurological stimulation, Puppy Culture, and given the Volhard Puppy Aptitude Test at 7 weeks of age. Puppies are then given a vet check at 8 weeks of age before they go to their forever homes. While we do not guarantee the health or temperament of any puppy after they leave our care, The Service Dog Connection is happy to provide anyone receiving a puppy with copies of the parents' health tests, puppy weight and treatment charts, vet records from the 8 week vet visit, and a copy of the puppy's Volhard Puppy Aptitude Test.
