Safety dress code for Volunteering:

Socializers are required to wear shoes that securely stay on feet (please no flip flops) and clothes that are comfortable to move around and get dirt on.

Whelper Helpers are required to wear close-toed shoes and pants to protect against puppies jumping or teething. We also strongly suggest no clothes with dangling drawstrings, as these can be very tempting for puppies to try and grab. Please only wear clothes that you are comfortable getting dirty.
