### Chapter 9: You’re Not In Charge, But Remember Who Is

Scripture: Joshua 5:13 – “When Joshua was near Jericho, he looked up and saw a man standing in front of him with a drawn sword in his hand.”

Psalms 33:16 – “There is no king saved by the multitude of an host: a mighty man is not delivered by much strength. The king is not saved by his great army; a warrior is not delivered by his great strength. The best-equipped army cannot save a king, nor is great strength enough to save a warrior.”

Joel 2:2 – “Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on my holy hill. Let all who live in the land tremble, for the day of the Lord is coming. It is close at hand – a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and blackness. Like dawn spreading across the mountains a large and mighty army comes, such as never was of old nor ever will be in ages to come.”
