— Faithfulness and Reliability Advanced Teaching Outline

I. DOCTRINE STATEMENT — FAITHFULNESS UNDER TEST AND SCRUTINY

- Faithfulness is proven allegiance to God when stewardship is examined, delayed, or opposed. (Luke 12:42–44; Rev 2:10, summaries)
- Reliability is measured by perseverance, not visibility. (Heb 3:14; Gal 6:9, summaries)
- God preserves faithful servants through testing. (Ps 37:28; Prov 2:7–8, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Faithfulness is revealed under examination.

II. FAITHFULNESS AND DIVINE EVALUATION

- God evaluates works according to faithfulness. (1 Cor 3:12–15; Rom 2:6–8, summaries)
- Accountability increases with responsibility. (Luke 12:48; James 3:1, summaries)
- Faithfulness endures divine inspection. (Rev 3:10–11; 2 Cor 5:10, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Faithfulness is accountable before God.

III. FAITHFULNESS IN LEADERSHIP AND OFFICE

- Leaders are stewards of trust, not owners of authority. (1 Cor 4:1–2; Num 12:7, summaries)
- Unfaithfulness disqualifies leaders. (1 Sam 13:13–14; Titus 1:7, summaries)
- Faithful leadership preserves continuity. (2 Tim 2:2; Prov 27:23, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Leadership magnifies accountability.

IV. FAITHFULNESS AND DELAY

- Delay tests reliability and motive. (Hab 2:3; Heb 10:36–37, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Delay refines faithfulness.

V. FAITHFULNESS AND SUFFERING

- Suffering exposes genuine reliability. (Job 2:3; 1 Pet 1:6–7, summaries)
- Faithfulness glorifies God under affliction. (Dan 6:20–23; Rev 12:11, summaries)
- Endurance produces tested character. (Rom 5:3–5; James 1:12, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Faithfulness withstands adversity.

VI. FAILURE, RECOVERY, AND CONTINUITY

- Scripture records restoration after failure. (Ps 51:12; John 21:15–17, summaries)
- Repentance preserves long-term faithfulness. (Prov 28:13; 1 John 1:9, summaries)
- God restores faithful service, not careless stewardship. (Heb 12:11; Lam 3:31–33, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Faithfulness can be recovered but must be guarded.

VII. FAITHFULNESS AND ETERNAL REWARD

- Faithful service is remembered eternally. (Heb 6:10; Rev 14:13, summaries)
- Reward corresponds to reliability. (Matt 25:21; Luke 19:17, summaries)
- Eternal faithfulness outweighs temporal loss. (2 Cor 4:17–18; Matt 5:10–12, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Faithfulness carries eternal consequence.
