— Fruitfulness in Righteous Deeds Intermediate Teaching Outline

I. DOCTRINE STATEMENT — FRUITFULNESS AS STEWARDSHIP

- Fruitfulness is faithful stewardship of God-given opportunities that produces lasting righteous outcomes. (Matt 25:14–21; Titus 3:8, summaries)
- God measures fruitfulness by faithfulness, not appearance. (1 Cor 4:2; Luke 16:10, summaries)
- Righteous fruit advances God’s purposes. (Col 1:10; Prov 11:30, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Stewardship defines fruitfulness.

II. FRUITFULNESS AND DIVINE APPOINTMENT

Teaching Emphasis: Fruit serves others.

VI. FRUITFULNESS AND PERSEVERANCE

- Fruitfulness requires endurance. (John 15:16; Heb 12:11, summaries)
- Weariness threatens consistency. (Gal 6:9; Prov 24:10, summaries)
- God rewards steadfast service. (Matt 25:21; Rev 14:13, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Endurance secures fruit.

VII. SERVANT IDENTITY MARKERS

- Faithful servants multiply entrusted resources. (Luke 19:16–17; Prov 13:22, summaries)
- Fruitful servants glorify God publicly. (Matt 5:16; Ps 115:1, summaries)
- Fruitful servants build lasting legacy. (Prov 20:21; Eccl 7:1, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Fruit identifies faithful servants.

VIII. SUMMARY CONSOLIDATION

- Fruitfulness reflects stewardship.
