

# **OBEDIENCE TO GOD’S COMMANDS — UNCOMPROMISING ALIGNMENT**

## **— Holiness and Moral Integrity Beginner Teaching Outline**

### **I. DOCTRINE STATEMENT — WHAT HOLINESS AND INTEGRITY ARE**

- Holiness is being set apart for God in conduct and devotion. (Lev 20:7; 1 Pet 1:15–16, summaries)
- Moral integrity is consistency between belief and behavior. (Prov 11:3; Ps 15:1–2, summaries)
- God calls His servants to walk uprightly. (Micah 6:8; Prov 10:9, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Holiness governs conduct; integrity governs consistency.

### **II. HOLINESS BEFORE GOD**

- God is holy and calls His people to reflect His character. (Isa 6:3; Lev 11:44, summaries)
- Holiness begins with reverence for God. (Prov 1:7; Eccl 12:13, summaries)
- God draws near to the upright. (Ps 24:3–4; Isa 57:15, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Holiness begins with reverence.

- God establishes those who walk in integrity. (Prov 2:7; Ps 84:11, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Integrity stabilizes life.

### **IV. HOLINESS IN THOUGHTS AND WORDS**

- God examines the heart. (1 Sam 16:7; Prov 4:23, summaries)
- Pure speech reflects holy character. (Eph 4:29; Prov 15:4, summaries)
- Self-control guards holiness. (Prov 25:28; Eccl 7:9, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Holiness flows from the heart.

## V. HOLINESS IN RELATIONSHIPS

- God calls His servants to righteous relationships. (Rom 12:17; Prov 22:24–25, summaries)
- Integrity builds trust. (Prov 20:7; Ps 101:2, summaries)
- God blesses peaceful, upright conduct. (Matt 5:8–9; Prov 16:7, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Holiness shapes relationships.

## VI. CONSEQUENCES OF HOLINESS AND COMPROMISE

- Obedience brings blessing. (Deut 28:1–2; Ps 1:1–3, summaries)
- Compromise leads to loss and instability. (Prov 5:22–23; Eccl 10:8, summaries)
- God disciplines to restore holiness. (Heb 12:10–11; Prov 3:11–12, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Choices carry consequences.

## VII. SERVANT IDENTITY MARKERS

- Holy servants walk uprightly. (Ps 15:4–5; Prov 4:25–27, summaries)
- Servants of integrity keep their word. (Num 30:2; Ps 15:4, summaries)
- Holy servants avoid hidden compromise. (Prov 28:13; Luke 8:17, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Holiness identifies true servants.
