

# **OBEDIENCE TO GOD’S COMMANDS — UNCOMPROMISING ALIGNMENT**

## **— Holiness and Moral Integrity Advanced Teaching Outline**

### **I. DOCTRINE STATEMENT — HOLINESS UNDER AUTHORITY AND SCRUTINY**

- Holiness is sustained covenant fidelity when authority, visibility, and pressure increase. (Lev 20:26; 1 Pet 1:15–16, summaries)
- Moral integrity preserves alignment under examination. (Prov 11:3; Ps 26:1, summaries)

Teaching Emphasis: Holiness extends beyond this life.
