


Preserve Your Archive with the OC Memory Lab



The OC Memory Lab provides our communities the ability to preserve their documents, photos, and audiovisuals through digitization. The OC Memory Lab is "a space for free do-it-yourself digitization" allowing users to safeguard their important documents and memories. OC Public Libraries has two labs, one stationary lab at Tustin Library and a mobile unit for outreach and convenience services.

Why digitize and preserve? Organizing your personal digital collection will help you locate, reference and re-use what you create. It also provides security. Losing track of your assets and online accounts is a threat to your online identity and personal security.

The OC Memory Lab is designated for users ages 13 and older. Children ages 12 and under must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at all times. Appointments are required and you will need your own storage device (a USB or external hard drive). You must also have an active library card.



Lab Girl by Hope Jahren – Wednesday, November 17th at 5:30 pm



Yes No Maybe So by Becky Albertalli & Aisha Saeed – Date and time TBD




Have a safe one and hope to see you at the Sept sale.




Hispanic Heritage Month Food & Drink Demo Thursday, October 14th at 6 pm
