

#### Wireless Printing Now Available

You can now print virtually any document or web page from your internet connected PC to one of our library printers. There is no additional software required. Your email address will be used to uniquely identify your print jobs and you'll use this info to obtain your document in the Library printing workstation. You would just browse your computer files to select the document you wish to print. You may also enter the URL of a web page you want printed.

To print from a WIFI connected device in the library, please visit <a href="https://www.printeron.net/ocpl/lar">www.printeron.net/ocpl/lar</a>

To print (such as an email message or an attachment) from a mobile device, simply forward your email to ocpl-lar-<u>bw@printspots.com</u>. Email forwarding is ideal for online email portals such as Yahoo!, Hotmail or Google Mail. The reason is that most online email services require that you log in to access email. If you provide the URL (web address) of your message, the printing services will be blocked because your email login name and password are not known by the print system.

#### Get Free Access to the New York Times Online

NYTimes.com, the OC Register and more are now up on our site and live for patrons to access for free! The landing page directs patrons to use the site either inside the library or remotely. There is a one-time registration, and once an "account" has been created, patrons simply need to find the "log-in" option to access their account.



We are so glad to have Rae!!!!








Rena Elhessen, Bellflower
