A 7-Day Journey to Discover Your God-Given Why

“For we are God’s handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.” Ephesians 2:10 (NIV)

Day 1: Rooted in Christ, Not in Performance

You Were Made for More—Let's Begin

Scripture:

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“Let your roots grow down into him, and let your lives be built on him. Then your faith will grow strong in the truth you were taught, and you will overflow with thankfulness.” — Colossians 2:7 (NLT)

Devotional:

Before we talk about purpose, gifts, or passion—we must talk about **roots**. You were never meant to live disconnected, striving, or self-made. You were made to be **rooted in Christ**. This is where your identity is formed, your courage is renewed, and your calling becomes clear.

In a world chasing image and influence, we slow down and say: *my why begins with who I am in Christ*. No calling is secure until it's grounded in Him.

You are chosen. You are called. You are His.

Reflection Question:

Where have I been tempted to root my identity in performance instead of Christ?

Call to Action:

Pause and pray: “Lord, root me in You today. Remind me that my worth and calling begin in You.”



Day 2: Your Story Isn't Random

*God's Been Writing
Your Why All Along*

Scripture:

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“You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed.” — Psalm 139:16 (NLT)

Devotional:

God doesn't waste anything—not the victories, not the valleys. Every twist in your story reveals clues to your calling.

Take a moment to reflect on your life's turning points. What pain has shaped you? What patterns keep reappearing? What themes or burdens seem to follow you?

Your why isn't found in a distant ideal—it's hidden in your actual story. The story God is still writing.

Reflection Question:

What events or themes from my past might God be using to shape my calling?

Call to Action:

Write down three defining moments in your life and what they taught you about God, yourself, or others.

Day 3: You Are Gifted for a Reason

What Has God Placed in Your Hands?

Scripture:

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“In his grace, God has given us different gifts for doing certain things well. So if God has given you the ability to prophesy, speak out with as much faith as God has given you. If your gift is serving others, serve them well. If you are a teacher, teach well. If your gift is to encourage others, be encouraging. If it is giving, give generously. If God has given you leadership ability, take the responsibility seriously. And if you have a gift for showing kindness to others, do it gladly. — Romans 12:6-8 (NLT)

Devotional:

Your gifts are not random—they are divine clues. God doesn't just call the qualified. He **equips** those He calls.

What do you do effortlessly that others find difficult? Where do you see results, even when you feel unworthy? These are often indicators of how God designed you to build His Kingdom.

The enemy would love to keep you distracted by comparison. But freedom comes when you recognize that **your gift is your assignment**.

Reflection Question:

What strengths or spiritual gifts seem to flow naturally in my life—and how might God be asking me to use them?

Call to Action:

Ask a trusted friend or mentor: “What strengths or gifts do you consistently see in me?”

Day 4: Name Your Burden

*Your Calling Is Often
Hidden in What Breaks
Your Heart*

Scripture:

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“When I heard this, I sat down and wept. In fact, for days I mourned, fasted, and prayed to the God of heaven.” — Nehemiah 1:4 (NLT)

Devotional:

Some people chase careers. Others respond to a burden. Nehemiah wasn't looking for a leadership role—he was burdened by the ruins of Jerusalem. That burden became his mission.

Ask yourself: What problems in the world feel personal to you? What injustices stir something deep inside?

This is not just about what you love. It's about what you **can't ignore**. Your burden is often where your calling begins.

Reflection Question:

What breaks your heart in a way that might be God's invitation to act?

Call to Action:

Write down one burden you carry for the Church, a group of people, or an issue—and pray, “God, show me how to respond.”



Day 5: Clarify Your Audience : Your Calling Has a Target

Who Are You Called to Serve?

Scripture:

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***“The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is upon me, for the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to comfort the brokenhearted and to proclaim that captives will be released and prisoners will be freed.”
Isaiah 61:1 (NLT)***

Devotional:

God never sends without purpose—and never calls without people in mind. Your “why” isn’t complete until it connects to *who* you’re called to serve.

Is your heart drawn to a specific group—young leaders, the broken, the overlooked, the marketplace, the Church? Your calling will likely resonate with those whose pain you understand and whose potential you see.

Jesus knew His audience. Paul knew his assignment. And you’re not called to everyone—you’re called to someone.

Reflection Question:

Who are the people or communities I feel most called to serve, support, or equip?

Call to Action:

Write down three groups or individuals you feel drawn to. Ask: “God, where are You already working among them—and how can I join You?”

Day 6: Articulate Your Purpose

Let's Put It into Words

Scripture:

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"Then the Lord replied: 'Write down the revelation and make it plain on tablets so that a herald may run with it. For the revelation awaits an appointed time; it speaks of the end and will not prove false. Though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay'". — *Habakkuk 2:2-3 (NIV)*

Devotional:

There's something powerful about naming your calling. Vision becomes clearer when you move it from the abstract to the articulated.

Your purpose doesn't need to be perfect—it needs to be personal. Try filling in this phrase:

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"I exist to glorify God by helping [people/group] to [action/transformation] through [your gift or method]."

This isn't a marketing pitch. It's a compass for how you show up, lead, and multiply.

Reflection Question:

What would I say if someone asked me, "What has God called you to do—and why?"

Call to Action:

Draft your personal "Kingdom Purpose Statement" using the guide above. Save it. Pray over it. Share it with someone you trust.

Day 7: Commit to the Journey

Your Why Doesn't End Here; You're Called to Multiply

Scripture:

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“Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age” — Matthew 28:19–20 (NLT)

Devotional:

Your why isn't a finish line—it's a foundation. The purpose God reveals isn't just for your fulfillment. It's for **His Kingdom**.

As you walk in your calling, others will rise through your obedience. That's multiplication. That's legacy.

Stay rooted in Christ. Keep listening. Keep leading. Your impact starts with clarity—but it multiplies through surrender.

Reflection Question:

What next step is God inviting me to take with my calling? Who can I invest in?

Call to Action:

Write down one small step you'll take this week to live out your purpose—then take it. And invite someone into the journey with you.
