

Forever New

The New Covenant is not new because of when it came, it is new because of *what it is*.

Its very nature is *newness*. The Greek word *kainos* speaks of freshness, youthfulness, something unprecedented and ever-renewing. This covenant is not measured by the ticking of time but by the vitality of life. It is as alive today as the day it was sealed with blood.

It does not grow old. It cannot fade. The New Covenant remains ever new because the One who authored it is the *Living God*, and His Spirit is life itself.

“For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death” (Romans 8:2).

This is not just doctrine; it is a breath of fresh air to the soul. The old covenant brings burden, behavior, and bondage. The New Covenant brings liberty, identity, and joy. The old says, *do to be*. The new says, *be and you will do*.

The house of Israel, *Prince of God*. The house of Judah, *Praise*. This New Covenant is for those who will reign through surrender and live in continual praise.

“Put on the new man,” Paul exhorts, *“which was created according to God, in true righteousness and holiness”* (Ephesians 4:24).

This is not an act. This is a state of being, fresh, holy, radiant, alive. It is Christ in you.

And what will eternity be like? Not stagnant. Not routine. Not dull.

Heaven will be *forever fresh. Forever childlike. Forever new.*

“Behold,” says the One who sits on the throne, “I make all things new.” And He said, “Write, for these words are true and faithful” (Revelation 21:5).

The joy you feel in His Spirit now is a foretaste of the eternal freshness to come. The kingdom of Heaven is not food or drink, it is *righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit.*
