

Life rarely turns out like we pictured it would and we all face unexpected challenges. We may not have control over the challenges, but we often have a choice on our reaction to those circumstances. Our story blooms from this amazing journey and what we learn as we persevere through it. I am passionate about encouraging others, both in my writing and speaking, based on what I have learned on my own personal journey of medical, life, adoption, and parenting challenges.

Lori suffered an intracerebral hemorrhagic stroke at age twenty-nine, and then developed epilepsy from the stroke. She is a walking miracle, and felt called to share her story, and her journey of faith and perseverance, to encourage others. Lori believes God has a plan for each of us, but life is about your choices! Even with her difficulties, Lori and her husband, Dainis, were able to become adoptive parents to a sibling group of three.

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

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Interview Questions for Lori Vober

- 1. What prompted you to write this book and share your story? While leading my ladies through Bible Study on ZOOM during the fall 2020 and winter 2021, I clearly felt God prompt me to start writing and heard that small voice that reminded me that I was saved from a devastating stroke for a reason and had a story to share.
- 2. What are some of the challenges you have experienced? Infertility, stroke, epilepsy from the stroke, job loss and cross country move six months after my stroke, recovery, adoption, parenting, homeschooling, and a prediagnosis of ovarian cancer as my book was launching. Most recently, gall bladder surgery in December 2023 and the findings from a CT scan that I only have one kidney. I have learned to have the perspective that every challenge is an opportunity and can serve a bigger purpose in God's overall plan.
- 3. Why did you title your book *Choices*? We all face challenges in life, and life rarely turns out like we pictured it would. When we face these challenges, we have a choice how we react to our circumstances.
- 4. What main message do you want your readers to grasp from reading your book? I believe God has a unique plan for each of us, but it is up to us whether we choose to follow Him and what our attitude is in our different circumstances. I have chosen to persevere with a positive attitude and hope the way I have handled my challenges is a hope and an encouragement to others. When we face difficult trials, we always have a choice of how we react, and I am passionate about using the challenges I have experienced for a purpose.
- 5. **Do you have a favorite Bible verse you tend to lean on? Jeremiah 29:11-**13: ¹¹ For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. ¹² Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. ¹³ You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. **Proverbs 19:21**: Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails. **1 Thessalonians 5:16-18**: ¹⁶ Rejoice always, ¹⁷ pray without ceasing, ¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.
- 6. After going through the medical challenges of the stroke and epilepsy, why did you and your husband pursue an international adoption? We had always supported kids through Compassion International and had been trying to start our own biological family when the stroke happened. We still had the heart to be parents but were concerned with my epilepsy and disability. Because of our love for international children from Compassion, we chose international adoption. We really wanted to give a forever home to a sibling group that may not ever have that opportunity and biblically believed in James 1:27: Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

- 7. **How old were your kids when you adopted them?** 6, 8, and 10 years old One boy and two girls
- 8. What is your husband's name and how long have you been married? His name is Dainis, and we will celebrate 27 years of marriage on March 28th. We were just shy of our fifth wedding anniversary when I had my massive stroke in January 2003.
- 9. How has your husband reacted to your medical challenges? I always say now that I moved to Minnesota for my career but God moved me to Minnesota to match me with my Godly mate. I met Dainis at church, a month after his mom had passed away. She had battled hormonal cancer for sixteen years. We did not know it at the time what our future would hold, but God did. He knew I would need a mate by my side that could handle my medical challenges, and Dainis was already equipped from watching his dad take care of his mom while he was growing up. He is loving, patient, compassionate, and has stood by his wedding vows. He does a wonderful job supporting me, even when he doesn't always understand.
- 10. How have you handled the stressful situations, medical challenges, life challenges, parenting challenges, and still kept your marriage strong? It is not always easy and like any couple, we have our disagreements. However, we respect each other and put our love and commitment for each other above any fight. We also have recognized how different we are and what helps to fulfill our needs. I am a people person and need emotional support. Dainis is an introvert and very black and white. Many things, like the challenges we faced on our parenting journey, weren't fixable. The solution was a girlfriend mentor for me that I could just talk to. We have found it is important to recognize your differences and work together.
- 11. What have you learned through balancing your challenges, your kids and their challenges, and your marriage, that you would advise a newly married couple? Put God first and make church a routine and a priority. Don't let the kids ever come in between you and always stand united as a team. Always keep date nights and celebrate your anniversary together. One day the kids will leave and you will be full circle again. Make sure you still know that person you married when that time comes because forever is a long time.
- 12. What are your next steps in your writing journey? I am finishing my second book now, which is a devotional based off my story and story by other authors displaying perseverance, a positive attitude, determination, and resiliency. I am also a contributing author in several compilations. My goal is to also continue sharing my story and experiences as a speaker. One day, I would love to start a podcast for the stroke community to have a place to share their stories.
- 13. **Did you always have a desire to write and publish a book?** No, my background is in marketing and sales. Writing my story started out an act of obedience but then turned into both a new passion, a time of healing, and

a new purpose. This journey has brought me new friends, support, connections and taught me not to put God in a box but to always be ready and available to serve Him in the opportunities He presents to us. One of my favorite Bible verse is now Proverbs 19:21 NIV ²¹ Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails.

- 14. **Besides writing and taking care of the family, do you work outside of the home?** I have worked part-time in the past, but my main purpose is to use my journey to serve others. I find that this helps to give purpose to my challenges and an opportunity to shine a light back on God and all He has done to help me recover as much as I have. I serve as a Bible study leader, at several monthly stroke support groups, and within our church body. I have recently become the owner of a new German Shepherd mix puppy and am training him to be my service dog as I continue sharing with others in the community.
- 15. Looking back at your stroke recovery journey and what you have learned over the last twenty years, what are some highlights you share with your stroke and brain injury communities when you share?
 - All of our medical challenges were unplanned, and we must recognize our loss, properly grieve that loss, and then move forward.
 - We can still have joy and success beyond our challenges in our new normal and we just have to stay unstuck and keep moving forward.
 - Many times, our body and our heart will not align after a medical challenge so proper emotional support and healing is crucial. When we are left with a physical disability, we must be mentally and emotionally healthy.
 - Our perspective can change the whole picture. Challenges can lead to new opportunities.
- 16. How can readers and listeners best connect with you?

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
