Notes from the Artistic Director

Dear Friends,

One of our earliest supporters was the <u>Dunvegan Foundation</u>. They are a <u>Clan McLeod</u> organization that local Clan McLeod members Iona Baldwin and Ian Good introduced SPAE to when the clan held their international conference here in St. Louis. John Mc-Leod was then president and he and his wife, Judy, guided us to apply for a grant from the <u>Dunvegan Foundation</u>.

This summer I had the pleasure of meeting Charlene Boyes and Linda McLeod in Columbia, MO. Charlene is moving from grants chair to president and Linda is taking over as the grants chair. I was thrilled to learn that they support our mission enthusiastically. I am so grateful for their continued support and look forward to working with them.

SPAE is an associate arts organization with the <u>Des Lee Fine Arts Education Collabora-</u> <u>tive</u>. This organization works to provide arts education in school districts that are considered under-served in the arts. A majority of students in these schools receive free and/or reduced rate lunch services. (51% of Missouri school age children are under the poverty line.) Every year there is a Des Lee Kickoff where teachers and administrators come to see what the Des Lee group of arts organizations has to offer for the year. SPAE received

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a lot of interest in two of the research studies that I have written so I have been busy writing unit and lesson plans that meet state education standards. This will make it easier for teachers to incorporate these materials into their class work. It is very detailed but important work.

Our Scottish fiddle workshops with <u>Brian McNeill</u> are scheduled for October in five schools. <u>Brian</u> is still working virtually with our schools and it is working out beautifully.

<u>Jil Chambless</u> will teach Scots and American Song in January at two schools. They will perform with her band on January 31, 2025 at The Focal Point. <u>Jim and Susie</u> <u>Malcolm</u> will perform at <u>The Focal Point</u> on <u>November 1, 2024</u>. We look forward to seeing them again.

Thank you for supporting our work. We can't do this without you.

Today, I'm reaching out personally about an important issue that will impact not only SPAE, but the entire Missouri arts landscape: Will you please sign up for action alerts with <u>Missouri Citizens for the Arts</u> and follow them on <u>social media</u>?

For more than 40 years, Missouri Citizens for the Arts has provided a presence for Missouri's arts industry, including SPAE at the state Capitol. When funding for the arts is presented as a "discretionary" choice, MCA is there to remind 197 state legislators that for every one dollar invested in the arts, more than eight dollars are returned to the Missouri economy. MCA has successfully saved MAC from being zeroed out of the state budget to securing over \$10 million in the FY25 state budget to support over 500 arts organizations and events statewide.

Meanwhile, MCA has no paid staff, only volunteers. So advocating for arts dollars is tough work and they need help for full amplification.
