# **Application Process**

\*\*\*\*IF NEW TO JAGUA, TEST A SMALL PIECE OF THE TATTOO ON INNER ARM AND WAIT 24-48
HOURS BEFORE APPLYING FULL TATTOO\*\*\*\*







Clean and dry the skin completely

2 Remove the transparent film

Place tattoo face down on skin. Rub and wet the tattoo back, then hold for 15-30 seconds



Gently peel off the paper, and try not to touch the water for 2 hours



4-5 hours after applying



6 24-48 hours after applying ( Final Look )

#### Tips

- 1. Jagua tattoos can last for 15-20 days.
- 2. You can apply a layer of vaseline or lip balm on the tattoo to keep it last longer.
- 3. Avoid rubbing tattoos while bathing, and minimize exposure to sauna, steam room, hot yoga or jacuzzi.

#### **Post-Application Care**

Proper aftercare helps the design develop into a rich, long-lasting tattoo.

- Initial Color: Immediately after removing the tattoo paper, the tattoo may appear faint or nearly invisible. Do not worry! The stain will darken over the next 24–48 hours, reaching its full intensity.
- Avoid Water and Friction: For the first 2 hours, avoid washing the tattooed area, excessive sweating, or friction from clothing. Water and rubbing may interfere with the dye's development.
- Moisturize Gently: Apply a gentle, fragrance-free moisturizer to prevent dryness and flaking.
   Avoid lotions containing exfoliating acids, alcohol, or bleaching agents.
- Protect from Sun Exposure: Prolonged sun exposure can cause the tattoo to fade faster.
   Cover the area or use a gentle sunscreen if needed.

### **Tips for Longevity**

Jagua tattoos typically last 1–2 weeks, depending on skin type, placement, and care. To extend the life of your tattoo:

- Keep Skin Hydrated: Well-moisturized skin retains the stain longer.
- Gentle Cleansing: Wash the area gently; avoid exfoliating scrubs or loofahs.
- No Pool or Spa: Chlorinated or salt water may shorten the duration of your tattoo.
- Avoid Harsh Chemicals: Dishwashing soap, bleach, and household cleaners can strip away the dye from your skin.

#### **Safety and Precautions**

Though Jagua is considered safe for most people, there are important safety considerations.

- Allergic Reactions: Rarely, Jagua may cause redness, swelling, or itching. Discontinue use if irritation occurs and consult a healthcare professional.
- Not for broken or irritated Skin, or mucus membranes.
- Children and Pregnant Individuals: Consult a doctor before using Jagua on children or during pregnancy.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

- How long does the tattoo last? Typically, 1–2 weeks, depending on skin type and care.
- Is Jagua the same as henna? No. Henna stains reddish-brown; Jagua stains blue-black.
- What areas of skin work best? Arms, legs, chest, and back are ideal; hands and feet may fade faster due to frequent washing.
- Can I shower after application? Wait at least 2- 4 hours after removing tattoo paper before showering.
