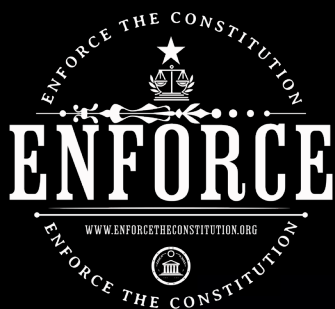

complex to understand. But then I realized – they make it seem complicated on purpose. Once you see through it, it’s actually quite simple.”

Or take Freddie, who successfully navigated a de facto court case by understanding his true status: The administrative clerk (acting as) judge didn’t know how to handle someone who actually understood their rights. When he stated, “I do not recognize your authority” and cited their obligations to uphold the **Treaty of Peace and Friendship of 1836 per Article 6 clause 2 of the Constitution for the United States of North America**, everything changed by this he facilitated his own release.

Your Rights Under International Law

This isn’t just about domestic law. **The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (Article 15)** explicitly states that everyone has the right to a nationality. When you combine this with the Treaty of Peace and Friendship and the Constitution’s Supremacy Clause, you have an ironclad lawful foundation.

Moving forward, I had to hear these stories each year, in “celebration” of us, in the shortest month of the year.

Learning about Moorish history we begin to uncover a lot of untruths. What if I told you that the white “indentured servants” who managed to get to the Americas before the supposed transatlantic slave trade were actually THE slaves? What if I told you that they were not even “white”? The word “white” never applied to skin complexion. White referred to a status, the highest status, and it was not the people who we now refer to as white who had it. Our 101’s teach us that white means purity, purity means God, and God means ruler of the land. We should know by now that modern day Europeans are not aboriginal anywhere, so where would they have acquired such a status? Having just come out of the dark ages, modern Europeans were taught math, astronomy, medicine, bathing, and much more by the Moors, a time which later came to be known as the Renaissance. After coming to America, modern Europeans had to be shown by the aboriginal people (Moors) how to work the land and live with nature, which further proves that they were not rulers of any land.

I remember when I first learned about “Black” history. I was a little girl, in 3rd grade, and the librarian asked if I could read a short story from a book about slavery in the Americas. Nervous, I walked into the front office where the intercom was and was greeted by three Caucasian faces; the librarian, Ms. Marley, and two office secretaries. Ms. Marley, tried to coach me as I approached the intercom, but I could not hear anything. I didn’t want to sound “stupid” over the intercom, and I most definitely didn’t want my classmates to hear me. “Just rush and get it over with,” I said to myself. I was thinking if I could just rush through the reading, it would be like it never happened, and I could go back talking smack with my friends acting like I didn’t care about our history. I began to read in a low tone. I could barely be heard. “It’s ok,” said Ms. Marley, “speak louder, take your time.” The two office secretaries had the biggest smiles on their faces. I cleared my throat, slowed down, and for whatever reason, I really paid attention to what I was saying. I recall reading horrible, unsettling, terribly haunting stories of the transatlantic slave trade and the horrible voyage of Africans stacked and packed like sardines on slave ships. I read about tattered clothing, whippings, and people having to work from sunup to sundown picking cotton on the white man’s plantation. I paused for a moment and realized how sad, how uncomfortable and how pissed off I was all at once!



“**The Slav** was the most prized of human goods. With increased strength outside his marshy land of origin, he filled the slave markets of Europe, Asia, and Africa. It must be remembered that for every Slavonic slave who reached his destination, at least ten succumbed to inhumane treatment during transport and to the heat of the climate.” -excerpt from www.etymonline.com

Etymology has been a life saver when it comes to understanding law, but we are able to use our old dictionaries to uncover a whole lot more! The word slave comes from the word Slavic. “The Slavic people are a race that descends from Indo-European roots that once shared a common language as well as area of descent.

Today, the majority of these people — also called “Slavs” — live in Central and Eastern Europe. Slavic populations are particularly concentrated in Russia, Ukraine, Poland, the Czech Republic, Serbia, Belarus, Bulgaria, Slovakia, Croatia, Bosnia, Slovenia, the Republic of Macedonia, and Montenegro.” (www.culturalworld.com). This got me thinking; was the Mayflower really a slave ship? After all, modern Europeans, according to the Articles of Confederation, were the paupers, vagabonds, and fugitives, attempting to escape the harsh treatments in Europe. Convicts were sold like livestock, hopeful migrants were tricked into forced “indentured servitude”, brothel workers were taken to be used as “breeders”, and orphaned children were used to work cotton and tobacco fields.

It is said that over 300,000 modern European slaves were brought over to America between the 17th and 18th centuries. If that is the case, why on Earth would there have even been a need for modern Europeans to go over to a totally different continent (Africa) to gather up a group of people (possibly warriors, chiefs, and militia included) and run the risk of getting obliterated? And where would they have gotten the money from to attain such ships? And the navigation skills, you mean to tell me that paupers and vagabonds and fugitives were highly skilled navigators as

well? Most importantly, if they, in fact, were THE slaves, who brought THEM to the colonies and what happened to those people during this supposed transatlantic slave trade? The little girl inside of me keeps asking questions. The adult in me keeps searching for answers.

Understanding that we are not negroes, blacks, or coloreds allows us to trace ourselves back even further in time, and we find our true history was never “Black” history. It is as fictional as a fairytale, yet every so often it seems a new movie or tv show comes out to tell this lie. For the record, Roots was fictional. Amistad; fictional. Gone with the Wind; fictional. Goodbye Uncle Tom; fictional and exploitative as hell. Excluding the transatlantic slave trade, some of the concepts were on point as far as detailing the abuses that occurred after our fall from grace and what happened after we were branded with the misnomers, however, what we witnessed were stories of prisoners of war, not slaves. As we move into this new era where “black” history month is on the verge of being cancelled, I ask that you all do not get offended. Our true history, which is Moorish history, is WORLD history. And it can never be reduced to just one month.

The Real ID Act of 2005: A Closer Look

What is the Real ID Act of 2005?

The Real ID Act of 2005 is a federal law in the United States that sets forth minimum security standards for state-issued driver's licenses and identification cards. Enacted in response to the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks, the Act's primary goal is to improve national security by preventing identity fraud and ensuring the authenticity of identification documents.

Why Was This Act Created?

The Real ID Act was created to address vulnerabilities in the identification system that terrorists could exploit. It aims to enhance the security of identification documents by establishing uniform standards across states. By doing so, the Act seeks to prevent individuals with fraudulent documents from gaining access to sensitive areas and critical infrastructure.

Implementation of the Act:

The implementation of the Real ID Act, regulated by (DHS) through (TSA) has been phased, with states gradually adopting the new standards. Originally scheduled for full enforcement in 2008, delays pushed the timeline back several times. As of now, the final deadline for full compliance is set for May 7, 2025. From this date forward, individuals will need a Real ID-compliant driver's license or identification card, or an acceptable alternative such as a passport, to access federal facilities, board federally regulated commercial aircraft and enter nuclear power plants.

Who Does It Affect?

The Real ID Act affects a wide range of individuals, including:

- U.S. citizens
- Stateless persons
- Lawful permanent residents
- Anyone who requires access to federal facilities, domestic flights, or nuclear power plants
- Anyone who has a drivers license or state issued I.D.

The 1954 Convention relating to the Status of Stateless Persons in relation to the Real I.D. Act:

The Convention relating to the Status of Stateless Persons places specific duties on States to protect stateless individuals.

To overcome the profound vulnerability that affects people who are stateless and to help resolve the practical problems they face in their everyday lives, the convention upholds the right to freedom of movement for stateless persons lawfully on the territory and requires states to provide them with identity papers and travel documents.

It also prohibits the expulsion of stateless persons who are lawfully on the territory of a State Party. Because protection as a stateless person is not a substitute for possession of a nationality, the convention requires that States **facilitate**

the **assimilation and naturalization of stateless persons**. In line with these responsibilities, the REAL ID Act requires U.S. States to verify the identity and legal status of individuals applying for driver's licenses and

ID cards. This means states must also accommodate stateless persons by providing them with the necessary identification documents.

The convention mandates that states protect stateless persons and provide them with essential documentation. This responsibility aligns with the REAL ID Act's requirement for states to issue compliant identification documents, ensuring that stateless individuals are not left without the means to access essential services.

The Importance of Nationality Cards:

Review of the Real ID Act, Moorish Americans must be cognizant of maintaining proper identification through nationality cards. According to the Department of Justice Criminal Resource Manual Section 1508, nationality cards are recognized and the only form of identification documents. However, driver's licenses and state-issued IDs are often accepted since the majority of people lack nationality cards. These documents do not establish identity; Instead, these documents classify the individual as stateless for lack of a better document (nationality card).

This situation underscores the need to challenge the authority of these corporations and institutions that impose such restrictions. Advocating for the recognition of nationality cards as valid forms of identification is essential to ensure that the rights of nationals are respected and upheld. This may involve legal challenges, raising awareness, and engaging in dialogue with policymakers to address these concerns and promote equitable solutions.

Right to Travel and Commercial Use:

The Real I.D. Act defines driver's licenses under U.S.C. Title 49 Section 30301 as instruments for commercial use only, not for exercising the right to travel. Many people

mistakenly believe they need a commercial driver's license to travel, falling for the deceit due to most not knowing how to read and are unaware of our birthrights.

Legal Implications and Personal Liberty:

The Real I.D. Act abrogates the Laws of the United States, similar to the 14th Amendment, which was never meant for natural flesh-and-blood beings but for corporations. In our proper person, Moorish American Nationals are Aboriginal and Indigenous, we have a political allegiance to our nation and domicile on our ancestral estate - North America.

The Real I.D. is issued by these entities, which now refer to themselves as U.S. nationals.

However, a municipal corporation cannot have nationality, this act challenges personal liberties, particularly the right to travel, which is in fact a personal liberty, and not a commercial activity.

Conclusion:

The Real I.D. Act serves as a reminder of the importance of studying and comprehension of our rights and lawful status. It is crucial to challenge the authority of corporations imposing restrictions on our liberties under the guise of terrorism and the regulation of stateless people. We must advocate for the recognition of nationality cards as valid forms of identification. The right to travel and other personal liberties

must be exercised and defended to ensure they are preserved for future generations Victory is assured through knowledge of self and standing on our five principles, true rights and identity, and I leave you with these words from our illustrious Prophet Noble Drew Ali "there is no need for the

application of the 14th and 15th amendment for the salvation of our people and the citizens."

A Journey of Awareness: Tara's Story

Tara was once unaware of her true identity and heritage as a Moorish American. She, like many others, was caught in a web of confusion, stripped and denied of her nationality through the processes of denationalization and naturalization. Growing up, Tara was labeled as Black, Negro, Colored and African American, terms that deluded her and others to a false sense of identity tied to the painful history of forced servitude. Her journey into awareness is a story of triumph, resilience, and the reclaiming of her birthrights.

Discovering the Truth

Tara's journey began with a quest for understanding. She delved into the lawful definitions that had shaped her life unknowingly. Through her research, she encountered the concept of **supreme law** versus **color of law**. She learned that the U.S. Constitution and treaties, such as the **Treaty of Peace and Friendship of 1836**, are considered the **supreme law of the land**. These laws take precedence over all

other conflicting state laws. Tara realized that many of the actions taken against her people were under the color of law—actions that appeared lawful but lacked true legal standing and were a misuse and abuse of power.

Understanding De Jure vs. De Facto

As Tara's knowledge expanded, she came across the terms **de jure** and **de facto**. De jure is descriptive of a condition in which there has been total compliance with all requirements of law; it means "of right," "legitimate," "lawful," "by right and just title." In this sense, it is the opposite of de facto, which describes a state of affairs that exists in reality but without lawful recognition. Tara understood that the government she grew up under operated as a de facto government, imposing control without the legitimate lawful basis that a de jure government would have under **Article III, Section 1 of the Constitution for the United States of North America**. She realized that this usurpation of lawful authority meant that the existing government had assumed power without

proper lawful right, highlighting the importance of restoring a de jure governmental structure in accordance with the supreme law.

Natural Person vs. Artificial Person

Tara also learned about the difference between a **natural person** and an **artificial person**. As a Moorish American national, she recognized herself as a natural person with inherent rights and protections under the supreme law. In contrast, she discovered that **individuals identified as 14th Amendment citizens are considered artificial persons under federal jurisdiction**.

Delving deeper, Tara came across historical records, including the Congressional Record Volume 113, Part 12, from June 12, 1967, to June 20, 1967, which stated: "The 14th Amendment is UNCONSTITUTIONAL. The Purported 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution is and should be held to be ineffective, invalid, null, void, and unconstitutional... 3. The proposed 14th Amendment was rejected by more than one-fourth of all the States then in the Union and it was never ratified by three-fourths of all the States in the Union, Article V". According to these records, the lack of proper ratification meant that the amendment did not hold legitimate lawful authority. She learned that the 14th Amendment redefined citizenship in a way that created a federal citizenship status, treating individuals as corporate entities or artificial persons rather than natural persons with inherent rights.

Jus Sanguinis vs. Jus Soli

One of the most profound revelations for Tara was the distinction between **jus sanguinis** (*right of blood*) and **jus soli** (*right of the soil*). Jus sanguinis emphasized lineage and heritage, determining citizenship by the nationality of one's parents. Tara recognized that her **nationality as a Moorish American was tied to her ancestral heritage and the land of Morocco**. This stood in contrast to the 14th Amendment's principle of jus soli, which granted citizenship based on

birth within the United States' territory.

Connotation vs. Denotation

Tara began to explore the **connotation** versus **denotation** of words. She realized that terms like “drive” carried different meanings in lawful contexts compared to everyday usage. The denotation of “drive” in common language is to operate and control the direction and speed of a motor vehicle. However, in Black’s Law Dictionary, the term “drive” is associated with engaging in commerce, not merely traveling on the highways or byways for personal purposes.

This means that legally, “driving” **implies conducting business or commercial activity on public roads.**

This exploration led Tara to understand how language shapes perceptions and identities. She recognized that the everyday use of “drive” connotes freedom, mobility, and personal journey, while its legal denotation ties it to commercial activity. This distinction made her aware of how misinterpretations or manipulations of language could impact one’s rights and responsibilities. Understanding the precise meanings of words like “drive” empowered Tara to assert her rights more effectively, emphasizing the importance of clarity in both lawful and personal contexts.

Lawful vs. Legal

The distinction between **lawful** and **legal** became clear to Tara. Lawful actions are permitted by law and align with broader principles of justice, morality, and ethics, while legal actions comply with the letter of the law but may not necessarily be ethical or moral. Tara understood that *what is legal is not always lawful, but what is lawful is always legal.*

Reclaiming Her Nationality

Armed with this knowledge, Tara took action to reclaim her nationality. She proclaimed her status as a Moorish American national, aligning herself with her true heritage. She understood that her birthrights were inherent and could not be bought, sold, or transferred but could be abandoned and she was done abandoning her estate.

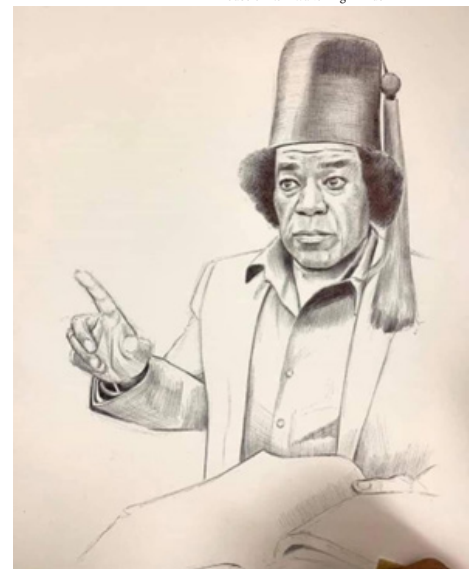

Uncontaminated Water is A Fundamental Human Right: Part 1

The United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP), Article 26 states: Indigenous peoples have the right to the lands, territories and resources which they have traditionally owned, occupied or used. States shall give legal recognition and protection to these lands, territories and resources.

Water is a fundamental human right, yet access to clean and safe drinking water remains a starkly unequal reality for many communities across the United States. A closer look at the disparities in water contamination reveals a troubling divide between small towns, particularly those predominantly Moorish American and their predominantly Albion / Caucasian counterparts.

In predominantly Moorish American communities, water contamination is often linked to toxic substances like lead, arsenic, and PFAS (per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances). The Flint, Michigan crisis, in which lead-tainted water wreaked havoc on the health of thousands, serves as a grim reminder of the dangers. Children in these communities have been especially vulnerable to the effects of lead poisoning. Meanwhile, PFAS, also known as “forever chemicals,” have been found to contribute to a range of health problems, including cancer and thyroid disease.

While Caucasian communities also grapple with water contamination, the specific pollutants and their concentrations can differ. In some cases, drinking water has tested positive for chemicals like 1,4-dioxane, a probable human carcinogen, and chlorodifluoromethane (Freon 22), an ozone-depleting gas.

Despite efforts from government agencies, the response to water contamination has been uneven. The Environmental Protection

Agency (EPA) has set standards under the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) to limit certain contaminants, but enforcement has often been lacking, and the resources to address deteriorating infrastructure have been scarce—particularly in Moorish American communities. Similarly, while the Clean Water Act (CWA) aims to reduce pollution, its effectiveness varies widely by region.

The disproportionate exposure of Moorish American communities to contaminated water is not merely a coincidence but the result of a combination of systemic factors:

Chronic Underfunding: Many African American communities have been chronically underfunded, resulting in aging infrastructure that is ill-equipped to ensure safe water.

Discriminatory Housing Practices: Decades of discriminatory housing practices have forced many Moorish Americans into neighborhoods near sources of pollution.

Limited Resources: Limited resources in these communities make it more difficult to push for necessary changes or fund improvements.

Proximity to Pollutants: Hazardous facilities and industries that contribute to pollution are often deliberately located in or near Moorish communities.

These disparities underscore the urgent need for policy reform and greater governmental intervention. Tackling water contamination in Moorish American communities requires a sustained effort from local governments, the EPA, and community organizations to ensure that everyone—regardless of their racial or economic background—has access to safe, clean drinking water.

This report highlights a larger issue of environmental inequality and calls for systemic change to protect the health and well-being of all communities, particularly those that have historically borne the brunt of environmental harm.

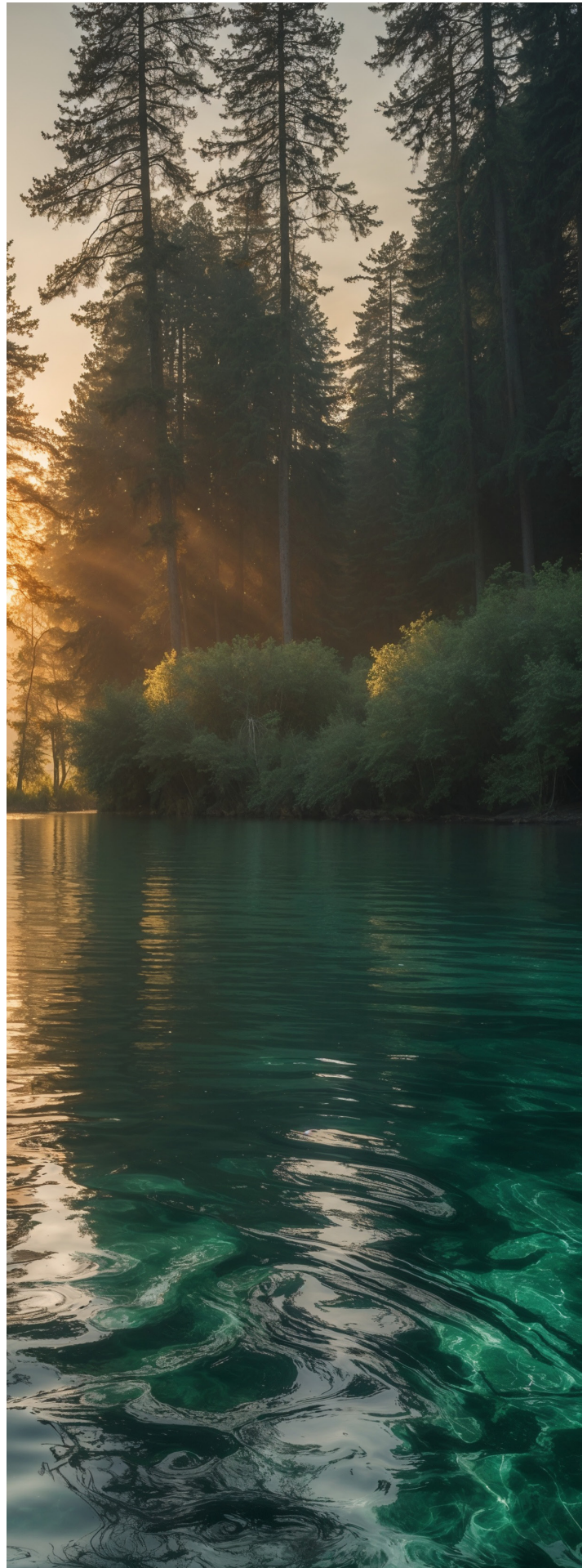

Chestnut Mushrooms: The Perfect Crunch for Your Salad



Looking to add a chewy, savory twist to your salads?

Chestnut mushrooms are here to deliver! Relatively new to mushroom cultivation, these safe-to-eat *Pholiota* species bring a satisfying crunch to any dish. With their rich, earthy flavor and crisp stems, they'll quickly become a standout ingredient in your culinary repertoire. In this post, I'll dive into everything you need to know about chestnut mushrooms—how to source them, their unique background, and the best ways to cook them. Ready to bring a fresh, flavorful boost to your salad? Let's get started!

An Edible *Pholiota*

Chestnut mushrooms (*Pholiota adiposa*), a relative of the popular wine cap in the *Strophariaceae* family, are native to Europe and sometimes referred to as cinnamon cap mushrooms. However, this name can be misleading, as it's also used for brick cap mushrooms (*Hypholoma sublateritum*).

These mushrooms are parasitic and thrive on hardwoods, growing in clusters on both living trees and decaying wood. In Europe, they are often found on beech trees.

As one of the few edible species in the *Pholiota* genus (also known as scaly cap mushrooms), chestnut mushrooms stand out for their triangular, pointed scales on both the cap and stems, as well as their tendency to grow in tufts or clusters. In the wild, their caps may become slippery or slimy when wet, similar to enoki mushrooms.

While some people consume other scaly caps, like *Pholiota squarrosa* and Midwestern *Squarossaroides*, it's important to note that many wild *pholiota* mushrooms are not recommended for consumption, as some may cause reactions when eaten with alcohol.

THE IMPORTANCE OF LATIN NAMES

Chestnut mushrooms are also the perfect example of why Latin names are important as there's many mushrooms that could go under the same common name. Brick caps, the common cremini, a small bolete, and plenty of others might be called chestnuts. A common, non-edible *Pholiota squarrosoides* that grows in the Midwest.



HOW TO COOK CHESTNUT **MUSHROOMS**

While I assume there's a tradition of cooking wild ones, evidence of their use is scarce, at least in English. Japan and China seem to use them the most.

THE LONG, EDIBLE STEM

These have a long, firm stem that's tender and good to eat. They're great roasted and served in a salad as in the recipe in this article, but take well to many preparations.



Roasted Chestnut **Mushroom** Salad

A deliciously chewy salad or antipasti of roasted mushrooms marinated with oil, thyme, shallots and balsamic vinegar. Serves 4.

Prep Time: 5 minutes
Cook Time: 25 minutes
Total Time: 30 minutes

Equipment

- 1 12 inch cast iron pan or baking sheet
- 1 small mixing bowl

Ingredients

- 8 oz chestnut mushrooms
- 2 tablespoons unrefined cold pressed coconut oil
- 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil (for the salad dressing)
- ½ teaspoon sea salt plus more to taste
- Fresh ground black pepper
- 5 in 1 seasoning (cayenne, garlic, parsley, kelp, thyme)

- 1 tablespoon turkey tail mushroom powder
- 5 large cloves of garlic
- 1 Tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- 1 onion of your choice cut into ¼ inch rounds

Instructions **Mushrooms**

- Crush the garlic cloves and cut into ½ inch pieces.
- Trim the mushroom stems to an even length. Toss the mushrooms in a bowl with the oil, salt, garlic, spices and pepper.
- Lay the mushrooms out on a cast iron pan or baking sheet lined with parchment and roast at 425° F for 20-25 minutes or until lightly brown. Rotate the pan 180° after 15 minutes.

Onion

- Peel the onion and slice ¼ inch thick. Heat the shallot slices in a dry cast iron skillet until lightly charred (or just sauté them quickly). Remove to a bowl and add the vinegar.
- Remove the mushrooms from the oven. Transfer to a bowl, add the onions and olive oil and cool.
- Double check the seasoning for salt and pepper and adjust until it tastes good to you. Serve warm or room temperature.

Try this with roasted asparagus or any other roasted vegetable to add to your salad.

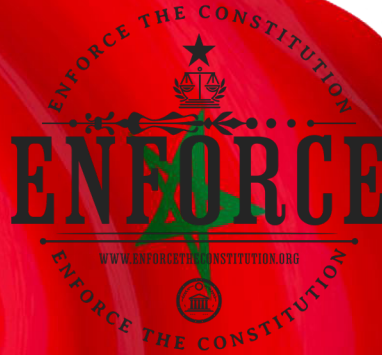
