you guessed it, there was gin involved!



So, What's Next?

Well, basically we have to wait from guidance from Scottish Government, Care Inspectorate, ELC and Board of Trustees to hear when we can restart our visiting and bus outings. I am currently completing new Risk Assessments for a phased return to the Day Centre with proposed limited numbers. Our Assessments must be approved by both East Lothian Council and Health Scotland. Until this happens, we will still be unable to access our Centre, but fingers crossed in moving forward.

I have to prepare you that I see our Day Centre being a very different venue from the one we have all been used to pre-Pandemic. We will re-open (as soon as we are officially permitted) on a rota system with very limited numbers, this is to ensure everyone's continued safety and to give everyone the opportunity of receiving the preferred service you previously indicated on our questionnaire forms.

As we move forward as a Service, our plans are to provide an initial 'Blended' style service for you all – Day Centre building-based groups (restricted numbers) and Home Visiting/Outreach for one-to-one support in your own homes. How exactly this is going to work will depend on our proposals to Health Scotland. I will keep you updated with our progress and any changes as they happen.

And so, to March.....

Ordinarily, our next Celebratory Day at the Day Centre would be **St David's Day** on the 1st March. Our White Twig tree in our hallway would be decorated with everything Welsh and daffodils would adorn the Centre to cheer us and think of Spring – sadly not this year




