**(See Health Requirements). Animals may not be unloaded until a fair official physically checks the animals and checks their health papers. No horse entries may arrive on the grounds before 10:00 a.m. Sunday morning, but must be on the grounds by 9:00 p.m. on Sunday.**

4-H members must have passed their eighth (8) birthday, but not have passed their nineteenth (19) birthday by January 1st of the current year. Exhibitors must be a McKean County 4-H horse club member by January 31st carrying a project in the field in which they wish to make an entry and be under the supervision of the Pennsylvania State University Department of Education, Agriculture or Home Economics staff or their designated representative.

Students enrolled in an accepted vocational school curriculum must be conducting a project in the class in which they wish to make entry. Students enrolled in general home economics in comprehensive high school are considered as qualifying. All entries shall be approved prior to the fair by member of the Pennsylvania Department of Education, Agriculture or Family and Consumer Science staff or their designated representative.

Exhibitors must be in good standing of a 4-H Club or FFA chapter in McKean County. May show both English and Western. ASTM approved helmets must be worn for all riding classes.

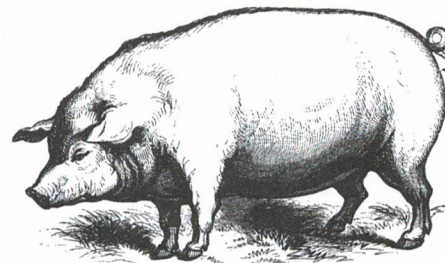

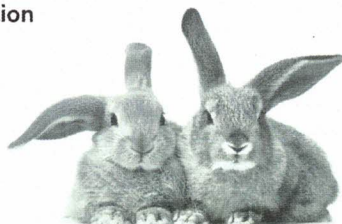

- Rabbits will be screened on arrival for health and show condition. No rabbits showing signs of contagious or infectious disease will be admitted to the show.
- Department Superintendent has the final judgment in resolving any dispute.
- All rabbits must have a permanent ear mark.
- Meat pens may be entered. They must consist of three (3) live rabbits, 70 days old or under; weigh between 3.5 and 5.5 lbs.
- Single Fryer – not over 70 days old; weigh between 3.5 and 5.5 lbs.
- Single Roaster – under 6 months of age; weigh between 5.5 and 9 lbs.
- Single Stewer – 6 months of age or over; minimum weight 8 lbs.
- The Fair Board and Superintendent are not responsible for the care and well-being of exhibitor's animal. However, all care will be taken to provide an adequate and safe environment for all animals.

- Showmanship Contest is open to any 4-H'er who has a rabbit entered in the breed contest. Exhibitors will compete according to their age as of January 1st (4-H age) with the exception of the Novice Class (1st project year participating in Showmanship).
- Rabbit used must be entered and shown in the Fair Rabbit Show and be owned by the exhibitor competing in this department.
- Exhibitor must meet with the judge and be scored individually. The score will be based on the following: carrying the rabbit to the table, posing, checking ears, teeth, eyes and nose; checking toenails, hocks, front feet, abdomen, legs, and tail; checking sex, checking fur, the exhibitor's appearance, actions, and knowledge. Exhibitor's knowledge will be tested by answering questions related to the breed exhibited, diseases, and standard management practices. The exhibitor is not restricted to a specific order for the presentation.
- Exhibitor will show in proper attire, which includes a long-sleeved top.
