DEPARTMENT 6 – GOATS

NOTE: Fair may choose to list classes suggested by the American Goat Breeders Association in lieu of those listed here.

1. Get of Sire shall consist of three doe from a particular sire with not more than one under one year allowed and not more than one animal from every multiple bush allowed. Get of Sire need not be owned by the exhibitor. Entries in this class shall be made in the name of the Sire.
2. Produce of Dam shall consist of two doe of different ages. The produce of Dam need not be owned by the exhibitor. Entries in this class shall be made in the name of the Dam.
3. A Dairy Herd shall consist of three milking doe of one breed, any age.
4. The Senior Champion Class shall consist of all first place winners in the first classes, or Doe 1 year old and under 2, in milk and older animals.
5. The Junior Champion Class shall consist of all first place winners in classes 2 and 3, or Doe one year old and under 2 years, not in milk and younger animals.
6. Grand Champion Class shall consist of best of breed in each division.
7. Only Doe entered in other classes may compete in Get of Sire, Produce of Dam and Milking Herd classes.

DEPARTMENT 8 – POULTRY & PIGEONS

All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds and pigeons entering an exhibition must bare an individual identification leg band. Ratites are identified with a neck band or an electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader.)

Entry Requirements

1. Exhibitors may be limited to the number of birds exhibited as exhibitors must provide own coop, however, check with superintendent as some coops and cages are available.
2. Only properly entered specimens and specimens listed under the conditions of the Fair's Premium Book will be accepted.
3. The "American Standard of Perfection" of the American Poultry Association and the "Bantam Standard" of the American Bantam Association will govern poultry judging.
4. A bird can only compete for one prize, except as provided for in special awards.
5. A judge shall not officiate in a class where he had an entry. Collusion between a judge and an exhibitor will exclude from competition and awards all entries of the offending exhibitor. Exhibitor's protest to such exclusion must be in writing.
6. Exhibitors will be responsible for their own birds.
7. Entered specimens must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and have been hatched in Pennsylvania. All poultry must be separately cooped and clearly marked as to sex and class.
8. During the continuance of the show, all birds will be examined carefully each day. Birds showing signs of disease will be segregated and properly cared for or returned to the owner at his expense.
9. Substitutions will be permitted before closing day of entries. No substitutions will be permitted after the closing date of entries unless the same breed, variety and sex.
10. Birds will be handled only by the judge or authorized Fair official.
11. Premiums will be awarded only on animals or birds exhibited in their proper classes.
12. In the absence of a protest, which must be in writing, the decision of the judges will be final.
13. Premiums will be paid only on awards indicted by the judge's records.
14. Entries will be accepted and premiums paid only on breeds, varieties and colors listed under the conditions noted in the Fair's Premium Book.
