## DEPARTMENT 13 – VEGETABLES

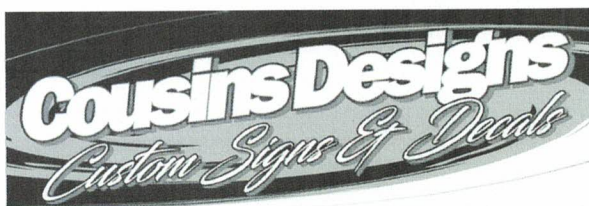

In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose such specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest, select medium size specimens. If at all possible, do not mix varieties.

The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge:

1. Trueness to variety type.
2. Uniformity in shape, size and color.
3. Be sure to pick out a perfect specimen, then select the others as similar to it as possible. Never mix specimens of different maturity.
4. Protect from dirt, disease, infection and mechanical damage. Select specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes of any kind.
5. Condition and maturity. Be sure exhibits are of high quality.
6. Tomatoes should have stems removed. Carrots, beets, etc. should have tops (leaves) removed from vegetables leaving about 2" of stems.
7. No exhibit may be removed before Saturday at 9:00 p.m.

Read premium material carefully, following all rules and regulations. If an entry calls for 5 specimens, be sure to exhibit that number; do not enter 4 or 6. In any instance, the exhibit will be disqualified if the correct number of specimens is not entered.



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
