
Monday Money Matter\$

Bitcoin's price increased a lot in November, gaining about 38%. Bitcoin traded near \$70,000 at the start of November and came close to hitting \$100,000 by month-end. Former President Trump's election victory helped boost confidence in bitcoin, with people believing his leadership might support the cryptocurrency industry. Investors think bitcoin's price could keep rising because there is less new supply entering circulation, while more people and companies are adopting it.


Objective: Discuss your answers to the practical application questions within your Money Mavericks Workgroups. Be prepared to share some of your group's observations with the entire class.
