This writer was dispatched to Myers Park in Reference 37 to a report of a well-dressed W/M with several small children who were unkept. Upon my arrival, I observed two W/M's dressed in coats and ties on the playground at Myers Park accompanied several small children. I also observed a Dodge Van, (blue in color) with Virginia Tag # XHW557 parked on the playground at Myers Park. This writer noticed that the children, (4 W/M's AND 2 W/F's) were very dirty AND unkept. The children had bug bites on their entire bodies AND scratches on their legs.

This writer spoke to suspect #1 who stated that he AND suspect #2 were teachers from Washington D.C. AND they were enroute to Mexico with the children. Suspect #1 stated that they were going to Mexico to set up a school for brilliant children. When asked about the parents of the children, suspect #1 became very evasive AND stated that the children's parents were in Washington D.C. 



The following address was given as her home address, 3918 W Street NW in Washington, D.C. Mary also gave this investigator a home phone number of (202) 338-8163.

This investigator questioned Mary on the purpose of their trip. She began to tell this investigator that the younger children needed to be "weaned" from their mothers. She stated that they left DC around Christmas time, and had been living in the van, and camping. According to Mary, Mr. Pettie told the adults to put the children in the van, and leave (to wean the younger children). She was unclear as to when she had last had a shower or bath. They had last eaten an orange in the van sometime before the Police stopped them.

When questioned about school, Mary replied that they did not go to school. She stated that they were taught at home.

When asked why, she stated that the "Game Caller" said that they could not. Mary stated that the Game Caller is a W/M named Marion Pettie. She stated that they wrote to Mr. Pettie using the computer in the van (a TRS-80). He would tell them what to do. This investigator told Mary that I did not understand. She stated that they were "different". She stated that they had a man of the roof, the game caller, who tells us what to do. She stated that they read bulletin boards and take notes on note pads. Mary said they would go to peoples houses and babysit. She stated that this was fun because they got to eat what was there, and do what those people wanted them to. She would not elaborate.

This investigator asked Mary who the other man was in the van. She stated that was "Kenny"....."Kenny Rogers". She said that he also calls himself Doug Ammerman. At another point in the interview, Mary also called him "Earnest Angel".

When this investigator attempted to talk to Mary about sexual abuse, she became very evasive. She denied any "bad touches", or any inappropriate behavior by the adults. Mary became very fidgety, and wanted to end the interview.

This investigator asked Mary if the Police had ever been to the house in D.C. She relayed a confusing story of Grandma and Kristin having a fight. She said that Grandma had kicked Kristin and the Police came. Mary said that she was in a big house for children, then they came and got her out. She was not any clearer about the incident.

Later in the evening, this investigator spoke with Max and Mary together. He (Max) was unclear on many things. He said his mothers name was Pat Livingston. When asked questions pertaining to time, he appeared to have a poor understanding or concept of time.

This investigator then asked about some of the games that they play. Max described one game as taking off the man's clothes, and putting them on, then going through the pockets for money. When this investigator asked about the men, and if all their clothes were off, both Max and Mary said No. They then stated that they only removed the men's jackets.

Another game was described as taking a shirt that had holes in it, and running away with it, then tearing it up.

Both Max and Mary advised that the women had come downstairs at Christmastime with no clothes on. Both children felt that this was very funny, and went along with the concept of it being a game.

Max also reiterated what Mary had conveyed to this investigator about not being allowed to live in the house. He stated that the men were told to put the kids outside, and that they would like to make the men stay outside.

The other children were too small (inarticulate) to interview. This investigator did observe certain behavior that was consistent with indications that these children were not use to being in a house, or using indoor plumbing. Both John Paul and B.B. wet (urinated) in their pants. John Paul wanted to go outside to go the bathroom.

When the van was checked for clothing for the children, several boxes of fruit and vegetables were found. The children were extremely hungry, and were given bananas, and carrots to eat. John Paul (2 yrs) ate approximately 8 bananas and a carrot. The other children were similarly hungry.

1. what the charges were. He was advised of the charges of child abuse. Suspect Holwell (aka Houlihan) laid on the floor of the holding cell and jerked his body. He refused to open his eyes, or acknowledge this investigator.

The van was inventoried by patrol, and towed to DeLoach's.

The children were scheduled to have doctor appointments on the following day (2/5/87). HRS advised they would handle the hearing at 8:15 a.m. (2/5/87).

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

On February 5, 1987, this investigator spoke to Detective Jim Bradley of Metro Intelligence Unit in Washington D.C. He asked this investigator if I thought there was a possibility there may be more children at either of the locations (W Street or 4th Street). This investigator stated that may be true, but I did not have any specific child that I knew of there. He stated that he was going to get search warrants on both the locations, and try to serve them later this date.

This investigator was also advised that both suspects were given a \$100,000.00 cash bond at first appearance. This investigator spoke to Captain Shlish at LCJ and arranged for the suspects to be placed in isolation. Due to overcrowding at the jail, the suspect's had to be placed together.

This investigator was also advised by Jane Pattilla of HRS that two children were confirmed cases of sexual abuse. She stated that the exams on Mary and Max were consistent with sexual abuse, and that John Paul had old bruises which were indicative of bite marks. Dr. Moorer was not sure if the marks were adult or child bite marks.

Following another group of interviews in an unrelated case, this investigator went

Item No. one hour. He told them that he was enroute to Miami. David Ammerman gave this investigator a letter he had received as a reply to a letter he wrote his brother. The letter contained two pieces of paper. One was a handwritten letter signed by Stuart Silverstone, stating that suspect Ammerman was enroute to China via Hawaii. This letter was written on a piece of paper with a letter head of GUNG-HO TRADERS, 1307 4th street NE in Washington, D.C. The other slip of paper contained in the letter was to Mrs. Ammerman. It was a letter which pornographically described suspect Ammerman's genitals, and thanked Mrs. Ammerman for having such a stud for a son. It appeared to be computer generated. The letter was signed by the "wives of Gung-Ho". The letter was post dated May 19, 1986.

Suspect Ammerman refused to talk to his brother of these investigators.

Suspect Holwell did speak to these investigators, but only to give basic information, and to ask questions about the children. He did ask if the children had been seen by a doctor, and if anything was found. He also asked where the children were. He was advised that the children were in protective custody, and were not in need of any immediate medical attention.

Several leads from other areas outside Tallahassee were given to the FBI to follow up on. Agent Pellegrino also spoke with suspect Holwell's father on the telephone. He is located in the New York area. Agents in the Gainesville area were also sent to interview people who had seen the suspects and children in their area recently.

This investigator and Agent Pellegrino also went to the Tree House where Mary, Honey Bee and John Paul were being held in protective custody. Agent Pellegrino took 35mm pictures (black and white and color) of the three children for use by his agency. The children appeared to be in good spirits.

He stated that he went to Gainesville to visit his daughter Kristin, who was then living in a woman's support cooperative. He stated that they lived in a rented house, and had a van. He met two other women; Judy, a woman in her 40's and Paula. Mr. Knauth stated that he was there for 48 hours, and when he left he realized that he had been very well manipulated, and really knew little of what was going on in his daughter's life. His daughter was pregnant at the time.

Mr. Knauth stated that approximately one year ago he and his ex-wife went to visit Kristin in D.C. His ex-wife was living there at the time. He stated that they went to the W Street address, knocked and got no answer. Mr. Knauth stated that as they were walking away, he turned around and saw someone looking out a window at him. The next day, they returned to the house. This time someone came to the door, and let them in, but refused to tell them anything about Kristin. Mr. Knauth stated that he became extremely aggitated, and left. He stated that shortly thereafter he received a letter from Kristin saying that she had been in Miami acting like a rich person, and that he (Mr. Knauth) had been talking to her husband, Steve (possibly Steve Usdin).

Mr. Knauth also advised this investigator that Kristin and another woman named Paula had "crashed" at his ex-wife's house sometime in 1985. She lived in Washington, D.C. at 3907 Harrison Street NW. He stated that she finally had to have the Police come and evict them from the house. This may help to explain Mary's story of Grandma kicking Kristin, and the Police coming.

Item No. Detective Witzig then started naming some adult names. He was making up fictitious names to see if Mary was creditable. She stated that she did not know any of the people he had mentioned, until he mentioned Mr. Lucky. We had learned earlier that Max had mentioned Mr. Lucky, in connection with the basement. Mary's eyes lit up, and she stated that she knew Mr. Lucky. She stated that Mr. Lucky used to be a "boy scout". He lived in High Fields. There were no houses there. She stated that there was "sort of a road" covered by tall, high grass. Mary stated that Mr. Lucky had lots of medicine, and had cured an earache she had once. Mary also stated that Mr. Lucky liked to be by himself, and listened to the birds.

NOTE: Information from the FBI identifies Lucky as Ronald Alleman, an ex-Green Beret. See case file.

From this conversation, we started talking about the basement again. Mary described the basement as four separate rooms; one being a laundry room, one a food room, and one a tool room. She stated that the floors were concrete. She stated the only hole down there was one in the wall in the food room.

We then started talking about the farm. She stated that they had goats and cats at the farm. She stated that they ate the goats. Mary also said that the cats "went away".

Mary said that they had gone to the farm on the way down to Florida. The itinerary was, according to Mary, Washington, D.C. to Virginia, to Kentucky, to Gainesville, to Tallahassee. They were in Berea, Kentucky while in that state. Mary stated that on other occasions, she has gone to Tampa, Florida.

Mary was first shown some pictures that the FBI confiscated from their search on the van. She stated that she did not recognize the pictures of the old man in the garden. She stated that she remembers the house, because it had a swimming pool in the house. She could not remember where the house was located.

The picture of the children bathing in the buckets was identified as Hill House. Mary stated that Hill House is located in Virginia, where the "goats are". This would be the farm house located in Nethers, Virginia.

The picture of Mary and Honeybee playing by a wood structure, were identified as being at "High Fields", where Mr. Lucky lives. Mary stated that the structure was being built by "Kenny Rogers" (Doug Ammerman). It was being built in the area labled as "OP", on the hand drawn map. (See case file).

Mary also identified two pictures containing Jan Shapiro, baby Walker, and Kristin Franklin (known to this investigator as Kristin Knauth). She stated that these photos were taken at "the white cabin".

When Mary was shown the hand drawn map, she described the area labled "white cabin" as the white cabin in the pictures described above. Mary described the red cabin as the place where Pettie stays with Jeff (Ubois), Raneé (Wynn), and Bob (Meyers). According to Mary, "paradise" is the place they play, and camp. leads from the white cabin. "Camp Core" is a place that Mr. Lucky has a big fireplace, and a well. Mary described Mr. Lucky as having a wrinkled face, and looking older than he actually is. Mr. Lucky also smokes cigarettes.

Mary also identified Jim Holwell, James Michael Holwell's father, in the photos depicting adults around a dining table.

This investigator had Mary clarify several items mentioned in previous interviews. First, the fourth basement is the "junk" basement. The punishment her mother received for taking them to the restaurant, was a letter from Pettie which made her feel bad. Mary said the letter told Paula bad things about herself. This was the second clarification. Mary described the "holes" as holes dug for defecation in the outdoors. The only hole in the basement is in the food basement, and she indicated that was used to put things that aren't used. Mary also advised this investigator that Toby is Toby Homer. No other information.

This investigator discussed going on trips. Mary stated that she had been on an airplane. She had been twice; once just with Paula, and once with John Paul, and Paula. The only person that said she saw anything was Ms. Judy Rupert at 615 Myers Park Dr. She is the babysitter there and the phone there is 681-9203. Her home address is 533 Truett Dr. 385-7401. Rupert said that she saw the blue van in the park two or three times a week since Decemeber. I asked her if it was the same van and the same children that were involved in the incident and she said that it was. She said that she did not notice any unusual treatment of the kids by the two adult males that were with them.

No one else in the immediate area saw anything.
