Author Jonathan Jones presented Moonlight Mayhem telling the story from the Bleeding Kansas years to the rise of Quantrill and eventually the raid on Olathe on September 6, 1862.

Quantrill's raid would shape Olathe's history for many years to come. Telling about life, on both sides of the border, he presented stories that heavily impacted the town that many today, have little knowledge of.

Jones stated there were no winners as a result of the Border War and that residents along the Border suffered greatly. Using map overviews of the Olathe town square, Jones pinpointed numerous business and homes from that time and a few that still exist today.



Flags representing the states of the Confederate forces at the battle are in the flag holders. Men from Missouri and Arkansas comprised the majority of Confederates who fought at Mine Creek. Compatriot Kennedy and Jenkins unveiled the memorial.



The salute detail, commanded by Compatriot Jim Speicher (COL, US Army, Ret), fires a volley salute to the dedication of the monument. Compatriot Speicher was the driving force for this monument. It is the second monument on a battlefield that he was responsible for, the first was the Missouri monument at Franklin, Tennessee.


Map/Directions to Matt Sewell's home for Camp picnic-

Compatriot Lane Smith recently represented the Sons of Confederate Veterans at the marking ceremony for West Virginia Confederate soldier, Sgt. William R Bosley. Smith traveled to Ellis, Kansas on Thursday August 15th for the ceremony initiated by Bosley's 3rd great nephew, Mark Terry from Washington state.

The service included Mr. Bosley's wife Mary who was in the Women's Relief Corp, who was buried beside him. Besides Lane attending, several members of the SUV and the community of Ellis attended the ceremony.

The Confederate marker was provided by the Veterans Administration following Bosley's request.

Mr. Bosley was attacjed to the 62nd Mounted Infantry and served at Gettysburg with Imboden's cavalry. He also served time in a Prisoner of War before being paroled for exchange in May 1865. Born in 1839, Mr. Bosley passed away in 1922 in Ellis. Both his and his wife's graves had been unmarkerd until finally receiving their marker.



The 62nd Regiment Mounted Infantry completed its organization in September, 1862. The unit was composed of infantry and cavalry until December when the cavalry companies united with other companies to form the 18th Regiment Virginia Partisan Rangers, and at times the 62nd Partisan Rangers, the 62nd Infantry, and Imboden's Partisan Rangers.

The command was mounted during the latter part of 1863 and served in Imboden's Brigade. It fought in western Virginia, was active in the Gettysburg Campaign, then participated in various conflicts in the Shenandoah Valley. The regiment took part in Early's operations and disbanded in April, 1865. Its commanders were Colonels John D. Imboden and George H. Smith, Lieutenant Colonels Robert L. Doyle and David B. Lang, and Majors Houston Hall and George W. Imboden.
