

Lane Smith presented Robert E Lee to a "Daughters of the Confederacy" group on Saturday, in Baxter Springs, Kansas.

Lane's presentation included Lee's devotion to his family's Virginia heritage.

Joining Lane were Monet Keitzman from the Ladies of the Plains Chapter of the UDC and Compatriot Rick McPherson of the Key Camp.

Before a crowd that included members from the sponsoring group as well as those from the Carthage, Missouri Livingston SCV Camps, Compatriot Smith spoke to the family history of the Lee family and why General Lee chose to serve with the Army of Virginia instead of accepting the Command of the Army of the Potomac.

The event was held at the Baxter Springs Historical museum which was a beautiful and impressive venue.


As usual, Lane made an impressive presentation. Well done!

On January 21st, the remains of **Confederate General A P Hill** were reinterred in Fairview cemetery in Culpeper, VA. Curiously, this was actually the 4th time that General Hill has been buried. The first was after his death during the war in 1865. Then in 1867, he was moved to Hollywood cemetery in Richmond VA. His remains were moved in 1891, placed below a monument that had been erected on his memory, also in Richmond VA. Following the removal of that monument in December 2022, his remains were moved to Culpeper VA where he was buried, again, on January 21, 2023.


