

SUMER MEALS FOR CHILDREN

It came to my attention this summer that the Story County Hunger Collaboration and the United Way have a program called "Summer Meals for Children". This program helps local organizations provide meals during the summer to school age children. There are 13 locations and they provide either sack lunches or hot meals. Some groups provide breakfast and/or lunch. The Ames and Nevada school districts provide buses to transport the children to the meal sites.

In reviewing the program, I saw that there are no such meal sites for the children in the Ballard school district. I have contacted the United Way and the Story County hunger collaboration to get more information about this program. I thought it would really help the Ballard children if there was a site locally that they could access the meals.

I will be reaching out to churches and businesses in the school districts to invite individuals in their organization who would be willing to learn more about this opportunity to help our children to meet together to see if we can get a group of people who will help with this mission.

The following statistics are provided by the Story County Hunger Collaboration:

- 16% of Story County residents are food insecure, representing 14,730 individuals (County Health Rankings, CHR)

- 10% of Story County residents have limited access to healthy food, representing 8,707 individuals (CHR)

- 26.5% of students receive free or reduced-price lunch (lowa Department of Education)

Because I feel abundantly blessed and have not known hunger, I feel called to help those people who are hungry. I hope that you also feel that need to help and are willing to join me in this mission. Please let me know if I can add your name to the list of people who will help feed these children.



Would you be able to come and help serve that day too?


