There were 71 applicants for grants, and Trinity was very lucky to receive this grant for Trinity's Little Free Pantry. We were awarded a grant of \$225.00 to help stock the pantry.

Ingathering Hunger Grant Task Force is an Iowa Conference program, all monies are to be used only for direct hunger relief. As we all know dollars matter when working to help those needing food assistance; there's never enough, and yet every gift, large or


small, is significant.




Summer Cryptogram
