# **Ash Wednesday Service**

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Its roots lie in the ancient Jewish festival of Yom Kipper, the day of Atonement. It means "at-one-ment." If we are to be one with God, with creation, with each other, then we must face who we are, make our confession, and open ourselves to the supportive power of God as we journey towards new life.

## **About Lent**

Lent is probably the oldest season of the Church calendar because Easter was the first day remembered by the early Church.

The word "Lent" comes from an Anglo-Saxon word "Lencten" which means spring. The season has forty six calendar days from which from which subtracted the 6 Sundays, making it forty days.

The number 40 suggests itself from the pages of the scripture. It is a number symbolic of personal preparation and confession of sins. Remember the 40 days and nights that it rained in the day of Noah, the 40 years Israelites spent in the wilderness, the 40 days the spies spent in the land of Canaan, the 40 days the people of Nineveh had to repent, and the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness. Anyway, we have 40 days in which to our influence for God.

How will your 40 days be spent? They are yours to spend as you see fit. Will they be days used in preparation for eternity? I hope you spend these days in prayer, meditating, scripture, and serving others. Bring your family to worship and fellowship. Have a blessed Lent season!

## **Christ Like Actions for Lent**

To help you experience the meaning of Lent, here is a list of actions you could do in the Spirit of Christ:

- Write a letter to someone who longs to hear from you
- Offer to baby-sit for a few hours
- Pray for someone who has no one to pray for
- Be patient with someone when you don't feel like it
- Apologize to someone whom you have hurt
- Fast on Good Friday.

#### **Sacrament of Holy Communion**


The sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated on Sunday, March 2. Come and celebrate the sacrament with your church family and begin the Lenten season.

  - o Tampons/Pads


