

New Life in Christ

On July 20th, 1969 Neil Armstrong stepped out of the Apollo II spaceship onto the surface of the moon. The next day an American traveling in Britain was greeted with these words, "Congratulations! Your landing on the moon was a great feat!" The American businessman who have never been higher than 35,000 feet in the Boeing 747 replied, "Thank you, it certainly was a fine accomplishment, wasn't it?"

Now the Britisher and the American knew exactly what they were talking about. The Britisher knew quiet well that the American businessman had not been on Apollo II. And the American was under no delusion that he was not personally involved in or responsible for the moon landing. It was American space technology that accomplished the feat. Since American space technology was paid by the American tax dollars, was approved by the American political process, and carried out by American scientists, it was an American triumph. Each American vicariously participated in the event.

Although that is not a perfect example to illustrate the point, but it may help us understand what Apostle Paul is saying in his letter to Colossians when he tells continued on Page 2

them, "You have died with Christ," and "you have been raised with Christ." (Col. 31: 1-17). Through this example, I want to present a frame of reference which will help us to understand the magnificent Good News that is ours because of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. A whole new dimension of life called "eternal life" is introduced to us by Jesus Christ. It is a life that is independent of biological life. But, rather, it is a whole new quality of life that is injected into the very person by God's action – sometimes called being "born again." The Greek word "anothen" is best translated as "from above" rather than "again."

To be born "anothen"-from above—is to have injected into our personality and into our very being a whole new principle of life which is independent of our biological existence. That is what is meant by the "new birth." That is why Jesus said, "Except a person is born from above," he cannot enter the Kingdom of Heaven. It takes that supernatural ingredient, that supernatural injection of spiritual life, that comes when we open our hearts and lives to Jesus Christ. For some that moment of change, that moment of experiencing this new life, is a dramatic experience. For many of us it's an experience of gradual awareness of Jesus' presence in our lives. We simply know that, as a result of having been raised in a Christian home and having heard the gospel all our lives, we have come to believe it. It does not make any difference how we were born from above, but rather, that we have been born from above.
