Our club supports the Hope Food Pantry which is open once a week. In February we brought canned chunky soups to our meeting and donated a total of 158.8 pounds to the pantry. When we were no longer able to meet in person, club members chose to donate money so the pantry could purchase items no longer available from the Oregon Food Bank.

In August we met at an Oregon City park (where we could be a safe distance apart) and held a community food drive. We collected 477 pounds of food and \$480 in cash donations.

Members were involved in shopping for food items, organizing the items purchased or collected, picking up donations from local grocery stores, delivering items to the pantry, packing food boxes (the pantry had to shift to a drive-though food box pantry), stocking shelves, taking telephone orders from clients, and delivering food boxes to clients' cars.

The club Civic Improvement/Social Services Committee designated \$700.00 of their budget for Hope and members donated another \$2990.00.

# ZOOM ETIQUETTE

- Join early aim for 5-10 minutes before the meeting start time if possible to leave time for troubleshooting any unforeseen issues that arise.
- Find a quiet space without interruptions / background noise
- Have good lighting on your face so you can be seen clearly
- Ideally have your video on unless you are experiencing connection issues
- Have a plain background avoid backlight from bright windows

#### oOr use a Virtual Background

 Position your camera to be at eye level if possible – especially take note of the angle of your laptop screen if using the built-in camera. Placing books or a box under your laptop to make it higher is a useful tip.

- •Mute your microphone when not talking
- •Raise Your Hand, when you want to talk
- Try to avoid talking over / at the same time as other participants
- •**Be aware you are on camera** and try to avoid doing other tasks, checking emails, looking at your phone, eating, etc.. Turn your phone to silent.
- olf you are Calling In Only, listen the instructions. You will need to put in the login id followed by the # sign. It then asks for the participant's code. If you do not have one, then put in a # sign. Then put in the passcode, followed by the # sign.
