The History of the General Federation of Woman's Club continues...1975 - 1978

1975~ GFWC receives a major grant from Law Enforcement Assistance Administration of the U.S. Department of Justice to activate "Hands Up", a national program to promote awareness of the citizen's role in preventing and combating crime.

1976- GFWC establishes a Trust Fund for the Arts in partnership with Affiliate Artists, Inc. The program supports nationwide young artists in-residence programs.

1977- GFWC members participate in International Women's Year programs, meetings on Women's issues, and the National Conference for Women held in Houston, Texas.

1978~ In partnership with Owens Corning, GFWC develops a nationwide "Home Energy Check" program to encourage energy conservation.
