

The History of The General Federation of Women's Clubs 1800's

1868 - Professional journalist Jane Cunningham Croly, is denied entrance to an all-male press club event and responds by organizing a woman's club. Jennie June - as she is known - names the club Sorosis, a Greek word meaning, "an aggregation, a sweet flavor of many fruits."

1889 - The Sorosis Club of New York City convenes 61 women's clubs from around the country to organize a federation. Sorosis President Ella Dietz Clymer articulates the goal. "We look for unity, but unity in diversity." Which appears on the first GFWC pin in 1892.

1890 - On April 24, at the Scottish Rite Hall in New York City, 63 delegates from 17 states ratify the constitution of the General Federation of Women's Clubs. Clubwoman Julia Ward Howe is one of the constitution's authors.

1891 - The first GFWC council meets in West Orange, N.J. After a luncheon hosted by his wife Mina, Thomas A. Edison invited delegates to his lab for a demonstration of the kinetoscope, an early motion picture projection.
