# Growing in Faith and Independence: Why Time Away From Home at Camp Matters

In a world where children and youth are more connected than ever, to their devices, their schedules, and the familiar rhythms of home, there is something profoundly valuable about stepping away. A Christian sleep-away summer camp offers young people a rare and meaningful opportunity to experience life beyond their usual surroundings, and in doing so, discover not only their own strengths, but also a deeper understanding of God's presence in their lives.

One of the greatest gifts camp provides is the chance to grow in independence. At home, routines are often guided by parents and caregivers, meals are prepared, schedules are managed, and support is always within arm's reach. Camp gently removes some of those safety nets, placing children in an environment where they are encouraged to take ownership of their daily lives. Whether it's remembering to be on time for activities, keeping track of their belongings, or making decisions about how to spend free time, campers begin to rely on themselves in new ways, while also learning to trust in God's guidance along the way.

This independence doesn't happen in isolation. Christian camp is a community grounded in faith, one built on encouragement, grace, and shared belief. Surrounded by caring counselors who model Christ-like leadership and peers who are growing in their own faith, children learn that they are never truly alone. Through daily devotions, worship, prayer, and meaningful conversations, campers are reminded that God walks with them in every challenge and every triumph.

Time away from home also fosters resilience. Without the immediate comfort of familiar surroundings, children learn how to cope with discomfort, adapt to change, and work through problems. In a Christian camp setting, these moments become opportunities to lean into faith, turning to prayer, scripture, and the support of their community. Each small success builds confidence, reinforcing not only the idea that "I can do this," but also "With God's help, I am capable of more than I imagined."

Equally important is the social and spiritual growth that happens at camp. In a setting intentionally rooted in Christian values, campers are encouraged to treat one another with kindness, compassion, and respect. They form friendships that go deeper than shared interests, relationships grounded in faith and mutual support. They learn what it means to live in community, to forgive, to encourage, and to serve others, reflecting the love of Christ in their daily interactions.

Perhaps most importantly, a Christian sleep-away camp gives children space to discover who they are in the light of God's love. Away from the expectations and labels they may carry at home or school, they can explore their identity as individuals created and cherished by God. They begin to understand that independence isn't just about doing things on their own, it's about growing into the person God has called them to be, with confidence, purpose, and faith.

As parents and caregivers, it can be difficult to watch children step out into the unknown. But it is often in those moments, when they are given the chance to stand on their own, that both personal and spiritual growth take root. Christian sleep-away camp is more than just a summer experience; it is a place where faith comes alive, where independence is nurtured, and where young people are equipped with values and confidence that will guide them long after the summer ends.

And when they return home, they don't just bring back stories and memories, they bring back a stronger, more confident, and more faith-filled version of themselves.

## Camp Blue Diamond Staffing Update

With the retirement announcement of long-time Facilities Director Paul Witkovsky and Program Director Gabe Imler moving on to other ministry opportunities, Camp Blue Diamond has been navigating a season of staff transitions.

During the spring, our Program Search Committee carefully reviewed applications and conducted a number of interviews. Throughout this process, the committee remained focused on finding a candidate who not only understands the traditions and spirit of Camp Blue Diamond but could also bring a fresh perspective. Above all, a strong commitment to Jesus Christ and a deep understanding of faith within the Church of the Brethren tradition remained our highest priority. While we did not identify the long-term candidate we had initially hoped for, we are pleased to announce the hiring of our Summer Program Director, Sage Evans.

Sage grew up in the Roaring Spring CoB and has been part of the Camp Blue Diamond community since early childhood, growing up attending camp each summer. Over the past four summers, she has served on staff—two years as a counselor and two years as lifeguard. Through these roles, Sage has developed a deep appreciation for the impact camp has on the lives of campers. She speaks passionately about helping young people grow in their faith and the joy of witnessing campers overcome challenges they once believed were beyond their ability.

Sage also recognizes the many lasting benefits of the summer camp experience, including spiritual growth, new friendships, development of social skills, increased independence, self-esteem, adaptability, problem-solving, and teamwork.

Sage will serve in this role through August 2026, with the possibility of extending into late fall. At the conclusion of her tenure, Camp Blue Diamond will once again engage in a search for a long-term Program Director. The fall season is typically a more favorable time for this process, as it allows us to connect with candidates who may not have been available during the summer months due to other ministry commitments.

In addition, the Camp Blue Diamond Board of Directors has formed a search committee to begin the process of hiring a new Facilities Director. A detailed job description has already been developed, and an official position announcement will be released soon. While final details are still being confirmed, the anticipated timeline includes reviewing applications and conducting initial interviews in August, followed by second-round interviews with top candidates. A final hiring decision is expected in late September or early October. The new Facilities Director will then spend time shadowing Paul to ensure a smooth transition and the transfer of invaluable institutional knowledge—especially all of those important “little things” that often go unnoticed but make a big difference in camp life.

During this season of transition and hiring, the Camp Blue Diamond Board of Directors and search committees ask for your prayers. Please pray that the Lord will guide this process and bring forward the right individuals to serve Camp Blue Diamond in these important roles.
