As the pace of the year begins to slow and Christmas draws near, we find ourselves entering a season of stillness, a quiet pause between what has been and what is yet to come. Just as campers find God in the gentle moments of summer, early morning devotions, quiet moments along the shoreline, the hush before evening worship, so we are invited to find Him in the gentle moments of this season.

As we reflect on the year behind us, we give thanks for the countless ways God has used this sacred place. We remember the laughter echoing across the forest, the powerful moments of worship under the open sky, the conversations that drew campers closer to Christ, and the simple joys that made the summer meaningful. These memories warm the quiet winter months like embers that continue to glow long after the fire has faded.

As we look ahead, we do so with hope. Hope rooted not in our own strength, but in the promise of Emmanuel, God with us. The same God who met us in the fullness of summer will meet us again in the stillness of winter, and in every season yet to come.

May this Christmas season bring you moments of peace in the midst of busyness, moments of warmth in the midst of winter's chill, and moments of deep gratitude for the Savior who continues to guide, comfort, and renew us. From all of us at camp, we wish you a blessed and joy-filled Christmas. We look forward with anticipation to the new stories God will write here in the coming year.

# Summer Staff, CITs (Counselor In Training) & Vol. Nurses Are Needed

If you, or someone you know, loves camp and has a heart for kids, working at Camp Blue Diamond could be the perfect adventure! We're looking for counselors who are at least 18, committed Christians, enjoy working with children, and can live and serve well in a close-knit community. Being on camp staff is an incredible experience! Team members grow in faith, leadership, communication, and community life. It's also excellent hands-on training for anyone considering teaching, ministry, social work, or even future parenting.

Maintenance and kitchen staff positions are also available for those 16 and older. These staff work 8-hour days and have evenings free to join camp activities. Compensation ranges from \$250–\$300 per week, depending on position and experience. Room and board are included. The camp season runs June 11–August 1, and applications can be found at campbluediamond.org. Don't delay, hiring is underway now!

For youth interested in learning what counseling is like, our Counselor-in-Training (CIT) program is a great

opportunity. CITs are 9th–11th graders who support a counselor with a boys' or girls' unit. First-time CITs need to attend CIT Camp on June 6–7. After completing training, they may assist with Junior, Pioneer, or Tenderfoot camps.

We are also seeking Nurses (RN, PA, or MD) to serve during summer camp. Nurses administer medications and care for campers who are sick or injured. Housing is provided in the Ouch House, and nurses may bring their spouse and family.

# **Registration Reminders**

### **Registration Software**

In 2025, Camp Blue Diamond began using a new camp management system called **CAMPWISE**. This all-in-one registration and database program has helped us streamline our operations and makes registering for camp smoother than ever. You can also still register using the paper forms as always.

If you registered through CAMPWISE in 2025 or attended any program last year: Some of your information is already saved. You'll just need to review and update it. Please use the same username and password you created last year. If you don't remember your login, please do not create a new account—contact our office and we'll help you access your profile.

If you are registering for the first time: You will need to set up a new CAMPWISE profile with a username and password. Once created, your information will be saved for future registrations, making the process easier.

### **Discounts**

Discounts can automatically be selected when registering online. If you are using the paper form the following discounts are available:

- **Early Bird** If you register before March 1, you can take \$10 off a two-day camp, \$15 off a half-week camp and \$20 off a full week camp for each camper
- **Sibling** If you are registering more than 1 camper from the same family you make take \$25 off the second and each subsequent camper.
- CIT Camp If you register for another Sr. High aged camp you can receive 50% off CIT Camp.

Thank you for helping make Camp Blue Diamond a place worth recognizing, and a place worth returning to year after year.


# **Heritage Fair**
