



Summer Bible Study Reflection

Psalm 46: 10 says "Be still and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted among the Earth."

This message started every week of camp, reminding us that it's important to take a moment to pause and recharge while opening our eyes to the things God is doing in our lives. Even though we focused on that need to sit still, it hardly feels like that was the case as we enter September and the fall season once again. Ask any camper, counselor, or program director and I'm sure they'll all agree, it hardly felt like we were sitting still. Yet, Camp magic allows us to be in a constant state of motion while also being relaxed and observant.

For many, their week at Camp Blue Diamond was a reminder that God loves and wants to be in conversation with all of us. For others, this was the first time they had ever heard such a message. We learned how to get real with both ourselves and the world around us, how to be open to new perspectives and wild ideas. We spent time reflecting on how God calls us to include everyone, whether we're at camp, church, school, or even the grocery store.

We ended our weeks encouraged that these new perspectives can and should be shared so that others might take a moment to be still and check in with God. If we want to live Another Way, we must be open to what that different way might be. In a world where things are rarely viewed in technicolor, we can get lost in the black and white thinking that is so often presented to us. But when we take a moment to come to a place like Camp Blue Diamond and pause, our world becomes full of color and possibilities.

Sometimes, you need to immerse yourself within the rich green hues of the leaves and grass to remember we are all part of this stunning creation. Sometimes it takes seeing the vibrant red of a Scarlet Tanager or the gorgeous blues of an Indigo Bunting to remember that God has made us unique, with different gifts and experiences we can share, and share we must!

Matthew 5: 14-16 reminds us "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

Sharing our hopes, stories, and experiences helps to light up the darkness surrounding us. We are thankful for all who came to share their lights here this summer. Whether that was working on staff, volunteering, or attending as an energetic camper, you all made camp a much brighter place. We are thankful for all who supported us through donations and prayers this summer. Sometimes our prayers can feel small, but they light up the summer camp season like a whole field of fireflies.

Campers and Parents Willingly Supported the Chepang Girls

In 2022, Camp Blue Diamond proudly partnered with the New Community Project's Give a Girl a Chance initiative, helping Chepang girls in Nepal stay in school and build safer, brighter futures. Once again in 2025, we were able to partner with these same girls in Another Way to make a difference!

These young students face a grueling 7-hour roundtrip walk through mountainous terrain just to attend school. Along the way, they brave unpredictable monsoon rains and even monkey attacks. To protect their limited school clothes and shoes, most girls make the trek in worn-out clothing and sandals.

This summer, New Community Project launched a new way to help—by providing travel kits designed to ease the girls' journey. Each \$53 donation funds one kit, which includes:

- ♦ 1 pair of locally made shoes ♦ 1 pair of socks ♦ 1 school uniform
 - ♦ 1 umbrella (for rain and monkey defense—seriously!)
