Every summer the Program Committee chooses a Summer Project for campers, parents, staff and board members to support through financial donations. It's a reminder to all of us that our community reaches beyond our friends at camp and home.

This year, our camp project was to raise money for Feeding America. Feeding America is a nationwide network of food banks, pantries, and community organizations seeking to end hunger in America. Did you know, 119 billion pounds of food is wasted each year in America? This food waste occurs at all stages of production, from manufacturing and

transportation, to the food we simply don't eat in our own homes. Feeding America works to obtain food that would otherwise be thrown away due to poor sales, slight manufacturing defects, etc. and distributes it to their food banks and pantries across the country. Since donating a single dollar helps provide 10 meals to folks who would otherwise go without Camp Blue Diamond supporters were able to help provide 9,000 meals. 
