Summer Bible Study Reflection

Exodus 18: 5-24 tells a story about Moses and his father-in-law, Jethro. Jethro sees Moses, worn out from being the Israelite's sole representative to God, and offers him some friendly advice: no one person can carry the weight of the physical world on their shoulders, no matter how hard they try. While Jethro's comments apply to serving as a judge for the Israelites' grievances, they can be applied to all tasks. Big or small, trivial or otherwise, we can only carry so much responsibility by ourselves. You may be thinking, what does this have to do with Summer Camp? Well, quite a lot when you think about it. Each camper that enters these woods carries with them plenty of baggage, and not just their sleeping bags and clothes for the week. So too do their parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and guardians. Even the summer staff are not exempt from the outside world bleeding into daily life at camp. And yet, for one week out of 52 in a year there is a place where none of that weight feels quite so heavy. A week spent in a place so full of God's creation and blessings! A week spent in a place full of new friends that are here to walk a mile and bear the load.

We spent this summer talking about how we are Linked in Love, highlighting the ways we find ourselves connected to one another. Recognizing the common experiences of life reminds us that, as Christians, it's important for us to share the love we receive with all those around us. Sometimes that means accepting others as they are, other times it means being open to change and hearing (or speaking) the truth. As Jethro reminds us, linking together in love is a task better performed in community with one another. What better place to put this into practice than Camp Blue Diamond?! So, we did. We spent an incredible 7 weeks in this beautiful space caring for one another - laughing and crying, sharing/making amazing stories and memories, and focusing on the things that link us together instead of those things that divide us. Jethro closed his speech to Moses by saying: "If you do this and God so commands, you will be able to stand the strain, and all these people will go home satisfied." I think we can safely say that everyone left camp this year satisfied and looking forward to another great summer!

We give thanks to all of you. To all of you who attended, who worked/volunteered, who stood with us in prayer for another incredible summer, we thank you for being linked in love with us this summer. Blessings in this offseason, and we'll see you in summer 2025! -Gabe Imler, PD.
