New Safety Procedures for Summer Camp 2021:

This past year has certainly been a "different" experience for all of us. This includes our children and youth as they have adapted to online learning, physical distancing from friends, and more time at home. Adaptability and resilience are important skills as we navigate stressful events – and our children have learned to do just that!

Camp provides children with the opportunity to connect – with each other, with nature, and with God. It is a great place to explore, run, laugh, play, worship, make friends, and experience God. We believe a camp experience impacts the lives of children and youth as they gain confidence, make connections, build character, and know they contribute to the larger community.

Campers need Camp – and – Camp needs Campers! We are excited to welcome all our friends, old and new, to CBD in 2021. We're working hard to set safe guidelines and still have a fun and meaningful experience. As summer draws near, we will continue to communicate with campers, parents, and congregations. Here are several new safety precautions that will be in place at CBD this summer to protect campers and staff. If you have any questions about the policies, please contact the camp office.



- ♦ The number of campers per session, and per cabin will be strictly limited
- ♦ Camper arrival times will be staggered
- ♦ Health screening by a medical professional will be performed in a parent's presence at arrival
- ♦ Campers and staff will live and move as "Family Groups" (Cabin Units) for all activities
- ♦ Physical barriers will be installed in cabins to provide extra sleep-breathing space
- Regular ongoing health screening will take place throughout the camp session
- ♦ Meals will be served in Family Groups, which will be seated apart from other Family Groups
- ♦ A large tent will be near the lodge for additional seating for meals, rainy-day activities, large group activities, and as an extra outdoor program space
- ♦ Large group activities will take place outdoors or under the tent with physical distancing
- ♦ Additional handwashing facilities will be provided, as well as hand sanitizing stations
- Regular handwashing will be required of all campers and staff
- ♦ Common spaces and surfaces will be cleaned and sanitized regularly by staff
- ♦ Face coverings will be required when physical distancing is difficult, such as:
 - ✓ Registration and pick-up time when campers, staff and family members must wear masks
 - ✓ Indoor activities when physical distancing cannot be practiced
 - ✓ When picking up meals in the kitchen
 - ✓ During times when there's large group movement and physical distance cannot be achieved

Summer Staff Needed!

If you love camp and enjoy kids, working at CBD is the greatest. Staffers will grow in faith, make friends and learn how to be leaders.

Counselors must be at least 18, committed Christians, enjoy kids, and be able to live in harmony with others. Maintenance Staff need to be at least 16, and work eight-hour days with time off in evenings to relax or join activities. Pay ranges from \$190 -\$250/week. Room & board are provided. Camp is from June 7 to July 31.

RV Campground & Cabins

Need a place for vacation this summer? CBD's campground and the Lakeside and Rising Sun cabins are open. The campground has 44 trailer sites, 2 tent sites and a primitive cabin. All sites include a table, fire ring and water. Both 30- and 50-amp service are available on each site, and a few sites have sewage hook-up. The Washhouse offers toilets, sinks and showers. A dump station, dumpster, firewood and ice are available. Smoking, vaping, alcohol are not allowed, but pets on leashes are. Camp's Family Campground has a family oriented, quiet atmosphere. It is a great place to relax, enjoy nature and have family time. A Wi-Fi hotspot is available in the campground parking lot. A lake and sandy beach are open to guests for swimming and canoeing. Hiking, beach volleyball, biking and fishing are available too.


Both Lakeside and Rising Sun cabin have 3 bedrooms, a living/dining room, kitchen, 2 bathrooms, a loft, central AC and heat, and a TV/DVD. They are handicapped accessible. The kitchen has a refrigerator, microwave, oven, dishwasher, coffeemaker, dishes and pots and pans, making it ideal for family vacations. There are 6 sets of bunk beds in each cabin, with 3 of the bottom beds being doubles. Lakeside and Rising Sun require a 2night stay, the fee is a minimum of \$156/night (six guests or less). Projects and Road Update: The third project of CBD's capital campaign, a new washhouse for the RV Campground, has begun. To date the foundation has been completed and the blockwork

foundation has been completed and the blockwork is up. Camp hopes to have the building completed before the 2021 RV Campground season opens.

This fall, Diamond Valley Road was repaved.
First, culverts were replaced and ditch erosion was cleaned up. Next the old road was ground up, and then two layers of asphalt and a new berm were laid. Work was completed by Thanksgiving. A big thanks to the PA State Forest for making this project happen,





Please Support Camp Blue Diamond:

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Camp Blue Diamond lost over \$200,000 in 2020 due to the cancellation of outdoor school, summer camp and most retreat groups. Cutbacks at camp, financial support from friends and churches and a PPP loan from the government enabled camp to get through the year without having to cut fulltime staff or take on debt.

This spring, vaccinations are happening, and progress toward ending the pandemic is occurring. While Camp Blue Diamond is going to have summer camp this year, we know it will be smaller and more expensive to operate, due to increased safety guidelines, required smaller group sizes, extra medical and safety supplies, and the need to create a large, open air, sheltered space. This space will be a large tent, sitting near the Main Lodge. It is required since the Lodge does not have the required space for everyone to eat inside, and because several Lodge activities, like singing and coffeehouse, need to be moved outside to allow for more space and ventilation.

Countless hours have been spent creating a safe camp program for this year. All of us need reassurance that life will have a semblance to past times – especially kids. They need to see camp friends and counselors, do their favorite camp traditions, have Bible Study in the woods, and just be kids letting off steam.

A few Outdoor School groups will return for a shortened experience in the fall, but because of restrictions we do not expect outdoor school or large group rentals to return to normal until 2022. This is expected, considering we are trying to keep our families safe from a disease that has already killed over half a million Americans.

Camp did acquire a second round PPP loan from the government earlier this month. We are planning on having the Golf Tournament in August and opening the campground and cabins to families this summer. Even if we have Heritage Fair in the fall, we know there will be a significant financial shortfall of over \$100,000 this year.

Between now and camp's eventual return to normalcy, any help you or your congregation can give will be wisely used to keep the staff working and employed, the facility in great shape, and to offset summer camp expenses. Your support during this difficult time is greatly appreciated. Thank you.


