## Highlights from the Summer Camp 2021

Throughout the Fall of 2020, we spent a lot of time listening to the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and the American Camp Association (ACA) in hopes of being able to have Summer Camp in 2021, though we knew that it would look different from past summers. The ACA provided a Field Guide for implementation of CDC Guidance that helped us develop protocol, and we took part in many Zoom conversations with other camp professionals enabling us, with confidence, to move forward with our summer camp plans.

To provide a safe, fun-filled summer in 2021, Camp Blue Diamond adopted the following procedures:

- ❖ Offered 17 camps, compared to 20 in 2019
- ❖ Limited the total number of campers to 300
- ❖ Limited each cabin to 4 or 5 girls or boys plus 1 or 2 staff
- ❖ Cabin Units (Family Units) stayed together for all activities (Each small specialty camps acted as one family unit)
- ❖ Tested all unvaccinated campers and staff upon arrival
- ❖ Staggered arrival times
- ❖ Campers immediately moved in after completing testing
- ❖ Increased the number of hand washing stations (Including the new canoe sink)
- ❖ Had all meals served by staff
- ❖ Ate meals, sang, did games, crafts & coffeehouses outside
- ❖ Rented a large tent for rainy days
- ❖ Wore masks when we had to be indoors



We are grateful for an outstanding summer staff and a committed full-time staff that made it all possible. Campers and staff wore masks when in the food line, but for other than that, masks were worn very little, which was good news for all! Everyone was very cooperative about the pre-camp testing, and there were no cases of Covid at camp. Thanks to all the staff, volunteers and parents for a great, fun-filled, and meaningful summer camp experience for the campers. Your diligence and cooperation made it successful and safe!

He has an extensive knowledge of the operation of Camp Blue Diamond, and we are confident that he will embrace the position of Executive Director with excitement and commitment.

## CBD PROGRAM DIRECTOR OPENING

Camp Blue Diamond is seeking a gifted individual with a passion for outdoor ministry to serve as the next Program Director. CBD is a 238-acre retreat facility, summer camp, and family campground nestled within the Rothrock State Forest near Petersburg, PA. It is affiliated with the 55 congregations of the Middle PA District Church of the Brethren. The mission of Camp Blue Diamond is to encourage discipleship of Jesus Christ and to facilitate growth and healing in each person's relationship with God, others, themselves, and the created world.

The main role of the Program Director is to oversee all aspects of programming, working to assure that each is Christ-centered, allowing campers and staff to experience growth and healing in their relationship with God, others, themselves and the created world. The duties of the Program Director include but are not limited to managing and supervising summer staff, organizing retreats, helping to coordinate rental groups, assisting with kitchen and housekeeping duties during Outdoor School, and participation in Camp Board meetings, church visits and the American Camp Association. Outdoor ministry at Camp Blue Diamond requires flexibility and teamwork. In this spirit the Program Director may be called upon to provide help in other areas of camp as needed. The Program Director is accountable to the Executive Director and the Board of Directors.

Qualifications for this position include strong inter-personal skills as well as leadership, organization, and communication, along with a basic knowledge of program development, computer skills, and marketing. A Bachelor's Degree is required, along with camp leadership experience. The applicant must be a Christian and should be a member of the Church of the Brethren or have an appreciation and understanding of Brethren beliefs and values.

This full-time, salaried position includes health benefits, pension, a generous PTO/holiday package, and on-site housing and utilities. Review of applicants will begin on October 1, 2021. It is expected that an appointment will be made in November with an anticipated start date in January 2022. ## **Capital Campaign Update:**

The Camp Blue Diamond capital campaign is progressing nicely, with fundraising done and remaining pledges being collected through the end of 2022. Over \$694,000 was pledged for building projects, and an additional \$52,500 pledged to the Reserve for Replacement Fund.

About one third of the total, nearly \$250,000, was pledged by forty congregations. The projects of the current campaign include replacing the RV Campground water and electric lines, and adding new sewage sites (2018), renovating the Camp Office (2019 & 2020), building a new RV Campground Bathhouse (2020 & 2021), and building a new Multi-purpose/Recreation Building (date to be determined). Congregational support of the campaign through budgeted gifts, fundraisers and special offerings helped Camp Blue Diamond meet and exceed its goal of \$650,000, so the needed projects will all get done.



Due to the current, pandemic related, high cost of building materials, the Camp Board decided to postpone the building of the Multi-purpose/Recreation Building for a year or two. Currently over \$350,000 is safely invested for this last project.

## **A Gift to Camp Blue Diamond!**

The Kimmel family donated the porch furniture in memory of David Kimmel who passed away in March 2021.
