



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RALLY RULES

PLEASE REVIEW WITH YOUR YOUTH

- 1. Respect all chaperones and adults at all times.
- 2. Treat your peers with respect and courtesy.
- 3. No cell phones/electronic devices allowed when classes/activities are in session.
- 4. Headphones may be worn during free time only. No loud music.
 - a. No music with explicit language (cursing, sexual references/overtones, drug references)
- 5. Profane language verbal or non-verbal will not be tolerated.
- 6. Identification Badges are to be worn at all times.
- 7. Everyone is expected to attend all planned activities.
- 8. No one is allowed in restricted or non-program areas.
- 9. No excessively revealing attire. No bare midriff.
- 10. No yoga pants/tights.
- 11. No sagging pants, no underwear showing.
- 12. No wife beater t-shirts or shirts with explicit language, graphics, suggestions.
- 13. The Youth Rally and its committee members take no responsibility for personal items lost, stolen, or broken at the rally. *Please secure all personal items*.
- 14. No youth are allowed to leave the church or school campus without an adult chaperone.
- 15. The Youth Rally directors will decide upon any grievances.



BIBLE BOWL RULES

March 6 – 8, 2026 :: Atlanta, Georgia

I. Competition

- **Ø** All competing teams will participate in two separate rounds.
- **Ø** The teams will be given a rest period of 5-minutes between rounds.
- At the end of the second round, the scores from both rounds will be added together to come up with a final score for each team.
- **Ø** The team with the highest final score will be the champion.
- **Ø** Trophies will be awarded for first, second, and third placements.
- In the event of a tie, each team should select one participant to answer a tie-breaker question. One question will be asked to those participants until a clear winner is determined.
- **Ø** The competition may change based on time and any other unforeseen factors that require expedition.

II. Teams

- O Congregations are allowed two (2) teams per age group. Each team must consist of four (4) participants. Two (2) alternates can be designated for each team. Alternates are not interchangeable.
- Team members will sit behind each other, in linear format with eyes facing forward. No other seating formats are acceptable.
- **Ø** Age Groups and chapters to study for each are:

0	Ages 6-9	John 1-4
0	Ages 10-13	John 5-9
0	Ages 14-18	John 10-15
0	Ages 19-24	lohn 16-21

III. Questions

- Ø All scriptures will come from the New King James Version.
- Questions are privately prepared and sealed by a representative from a non-competing congregation. No questions nor study materials will be shared with participants beforehand.
- New questions will be read for each round. Once a question has been read in a round, it will no longer be used.
 - § The questions will come from the Book of John as listed above.
 - **§** All questions will be randomly selected by the moderator.



- § All questions will be multiple choice (A, B, and C).
- § Each question will be read twice.
- § Each team member will have a set of individual cards marked A, B, and C. Once the question is read and time is called, the team members will each raise the card they believe to be the correct answer.

IV.Scoring

- Ø Each question will have a value of five (5) points per team member, per question, per correct answer. There is no recorded score for incorrect answers.
- Once the question is read, the timekeeper will say "time." At this point each contestant should raise their card with their answer.
- Ø Five (5) bonus points will be awarded if each team member has the correct answer. With four (4) participants, this makes the possible number of points awarded for each question 25.

V. Coaches and Score Keepers

- Ø Each team must have one adult coach.
- Ø Each team will be assigned a scorekeeper.
- **Ø** The scorekeeper and coach will sit side-by-side in front of their respective team.
- **Ø** The scorekeeper and coach will both keep the score of their respective team to ensure that the scores are added correctly.
- If the scorekeeper and coach have a discrepancy with the scoring of a particular question, they must notify the moderator before the next question is read by saying "STOP!" If the moderator has completed the next question, then the right to protest is lost, and the scorekeeper's score will serve as the official score.

VI.Conduct

All participants must maintain godly and respectful conduct during the competition. Supporters must exercise unquestionable integrity, making no gestures or suggestive indication when questions are being answered. This includes thumbs up gestures, head shaking yes or no, blinking, and the like.



- **Ø** Supporters should refrain from handclapping during the active competition. Polite handclapping is allowed during breaks and at the end of the competition.
- Ø Other behavior not accepted includes:
 - § Yelling
 - § Cheering
 - § Whistling
 - § Foot stomping
 - § Calling out answers
 - § Answer signaling of any kind
- Ø If judges determine that supporters are in violation of these, there will be one warning issued. If a team's supporters persist after being warned, they will be asked to leave the competition, and their team will have two (2) points deducted.
- Ø It is expected that all teams and their supporters will behave honorably and appropriately during and after the competition. Should anyone have comments, suggestions, or concerns regarding event occurrences, please visit the registration desk where comment cards will be available for feedback.



<u>NOTE:</u> If a congregation is unable to form a team in an age division, a participant may move up to a higher age group to compete. Moving down to a younger age group is <u>not permitted</u>.

Once a participant selects an appropriate age group (including any move up), that assignment is locked for the remainder of the Bible Bowl. No switching back and forth between age groups.

Any move is upward only and permanent for this Bible Bowl. Participants who move up must remain in that higher age group until the competition is completed.

SPELLING BEE RULES AND REGULATIONS

March 6 – 8, 2026 :: Atlanta, Georgia

- 1. Each congregation will be allowed up to four (4) participants per division.
- Each participant will have 10 seconds to complete the spelling of each word.
- 3. The time begins once a participant says the first letter of the given word.
- 4. If a participant needs clarification, he/she will be allowed to ask that the word be repeated, ask for a definition, or ask for a sentence using the word.
- 5. Once a participant begins to spell the given word, he/she will NOT be allowed to change the order of the letters or ask for any type of clarification.
- 6. The Spelling Bee is single elimination, meaning that once a participant misspells a word or fails to complete a word in the allotted time, he or she will be eliminated.
- 7. Each congregation will need to select one (1) person to be a possible judge for the competition. The person chosen to be a judge may not be a parent to a child participating in the event. We will randomly select three (3) people from the pool to participate as judges.
- 8. Judges should be familiar with the spelling bee rules and regulations.
- 9. One (1) additional member per congregation will be allowed in the room with the participants. Participants may quietly leave the room after elimination or remain with the congregation member.
- 10. WE ASK FOR COMPLETE SILENCE FROM AUDIENCE MEMBERS AND PARTICIPANTS.

 SPELLERS WIL NEED TO BE ABLE TO HEAR THE WORDS, AND THE JUDGES NEED TO BE ABLE TO HEAR THE RESPONSES.

MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Each congregation will be allowed up to four (4) participants per division to form a team with one (1) alternate. When the team is given a verse, any of the participants of the team can volunteer to recite the verse by standing up and beginning the answer format as described in rule #3.
- 2. Each participant will have 2 attempts or 30 seconds, whichever is lesser, to completely recite each verse.
- 3. The answer format will begin with the book, chapter, verse, and translation followed by a recitation of the verse(s).
- 4. The time begins once a participant repeats the book, chapter, and verse of the given Bible verse.
- 5. The New King James Version (NKJV) and the English Standard Version (ESV) are the only approved translations for memory verse recitation.
- 6. The recitation must be exactly as the verse(s) reads: word for word and in the correct order as it is in the chosen translation of the two approved in #5.
- 7. If a participant needs clarification, he/she will be allowed to ask that the book, chapter, and verse(s) be repeated before they begin an attempt to recite the given verse(s).
- 8. Once a participant begins an attempt to recite the given verse(s), he/she must complete the attempt. An incomplete attempt will count as a full attempt. Again, there are only two (2) attempts allowed.
- 9. The Memory Verse Challenge is single elimination, meaning that once a participant misquotes a verse or fails to complete a recitation of the verse(s) in the allotted time, he or she will be eliminated.
- 10. Each congregation will need to select one (1) person to be a possible judge for the competition. The person chosen to be a judge may not be a parent to a child participating in the event. We will randomly select three (3) people from the pool to participate as judges.
- 11. Judges should be familiar with the Memory Verse Challenge rules and regulations.
- 12. One (1) additional member per congregation will be allowed in the room with the participants. Participants may quietly leave the room after elimination or remain with the congregation members.
- 13. WE ASK FOR COMPLETE SILENCE FROM AUDIENCE MEMBERS AND PARTICIPANTS. RECITERS WILL NEED TO BE ABLE TO HEAR THE WORDS AND THE JUDGES NEED TO BE ABLE TO HEAR THE RESPONSES.
