

Camps resumed with 7 held to date. Two hundred bags were completed for camps to be held in Queensland and at Teen Ranch.




 <u>New Member Inductions</u>, Dinner meeting on 26th April

• Birthing Kit Day, Sylvania High School, 3rd May.


600 kits were efficiently packed at the school.

JULY -


• <u>Vintage & Collectables Fair</u>, 17th July at Marana Hall, Hurstville

AUGUST -


• **Cushion Stuffing Day**, at Gardens on Forest, 1st August.

Other finalists were from Beverly Hills Girls HS, Endeavour Sports High School, Jannali High, Woolooware High and St. Ursula's College














<u>New Member Induction</u> Dinner Meeting 25th October Nadia McMaster was inducted and welcomed to our Club.




Members' IT Upskilling

Thanks also to Bernadette Mills and her team at the college who developed the program to suit multiple skill levels.






DECEMBER -
