2026 FOUNDERS TOURNAMENT RULES

There are new tournament rules for 2026. As a requirement for all participants, it is incumbent on you to familiarize yourself with and understand the rules.

1. The tournaments consist of a ladder phase and a single-elimination (play-off) phase.
2. There will be 5 divisions.

Mixed Doubles

In order to have a ladder phase, 6 participants must sign up.

If 6 participants do not sign up, there will only be an elimination phase for that division.

In addition, if there is no ladder phase, the elimination phase for that category may start earlier than dates included in this document.

2026 Founders tournament rules

- A. Please send an email to ptctournament@gmail.com if you would like to participate.
- B. The sign up for the Founders Tournament begins now and ends **on Sunday, June 7**. The ladder phase will commence on **June 8**.
- C. To encourage maximum amount of play, the initial ladder positions will be assigned by the Tournament Committee.
- D. All participants must register with the Tournament Committee. Last year's teams and participants must confirm that they are interested in playing this year. In order to participate, you must notify us ptctournament@gmail.com by June 8. If any changes after June 8, you will be placed at the bottom of ladder
- E. You arrange and play your own matches at your own convenience throughout the ladder phase. However, a match must, without exception, be completed before the next one can be arranged and/or scheduled.
- F. Each participant may challenge any position one time before June 28

- G. In the ladder phase you and/or your team can challenge up to 3 positions on the ladder above your current position. Exception – Positions 1 and 2 can challenge 1 or 2 positions below their current position.
- H. A challenger may challenge the same team more than once, but the challenged team is under no obligation to accept more than two challenges from the same team.
- I. A challengee can refuse/reject a challenger's proposed match date only 1 time for whatever reason and must arrange for an alternative date acceptable to both parties within a week. Thereafter, if there is such a refusal or rejection by challengee, it is considered forfeiture and the challenger will be considered the winner and ladder positions will be changed.
- J. If the higher-ranking participant wins the ladder match, there is no change in standings. If the challenger wins the ladder match, he/she moves to the spot previously occupied by challenged participant, and the challenged participant moves down one from its original spot.
- K. The challenger has the duty to report scheduled matches to the Tournament Committee via email to ptctournament@gmail.com.
- L. The winner has the absolute duty to report results to the Tournament Committee via to email ptctournament@gmail.com.
- M. You and/or your team must, without exception, complete 3 matches in the ladder phase for each and every division in which you participate in order to qualify for the elimination-phase (play-offs). Also, you must have completed matches with strict adherence to the below deadlines/dates in order to continue in ladder phase and be eligible for playoffs.
- 1st match by June 28
- 2nd match by July 26
- 3rd match by August 19
- N. After the ladder-phase, you will be entered in the elimination phase of the playoffs.
- O. For 2026, the elimination phase begins August 20, 2026. Matches will be scheduled and completed by the participants within specified-date ranges as follows:

P. Elimination-Phase Schedules:

- a. Women's Singles August 20 – October 11
- b. Women's Doubles August 20 - October 18
- c. Mixed Doubles August 20 – October 18
- d. Men's Singles August 20 – October 11
- e. Men's Doubles August 20 – October 18

Interim deadlines for each round will be posted and participants notified.

Q. Best of three (3) sets and USTA play and scoring rules apply. During both the ladder and elimination phases a 10-point tie breaker in lieu of third set is mandatory.

R. Both participants are to bring a new can of soft-court tennis balls to the match. The winners get the unused new can, and the loser retains the used balls.

S. As a matter of courtesy to other players at the Club and to avoid unnecessary court congestion, it is highly advisable that you play your matches during "off-peak" time of the day (from 12:00 pm to 4:00pm). Please send an email to ptctournament@gmail.com when you set up your matches to ensure that no more than 2 courts will be utilized for matches at any given time.

T. Please do not extend play as social tennis once match is completed if others are waiting for a court.

U. Tournament Committee reserves the right to modify any of the above as it deems necessary and proper. If any questions, concerns, conflicts or disagreements arise during play, please call or text Deepa Mathew (201-264-444) or Walter Trog (929-431-2313) immediately.
