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WELCOME TO INNISFREE

There are plenty of beautiful places to spend a weekend. What makes Seabrook different is how quickly it begins to feel familiar.

Mornings start with coffee and a walk to the beach. Afternoons disappear on bikes, trails, and playgrounds. Evenings slow down as the sun settles into the Pacific and everyone gathers back at the house.

Over time, these small moments became traditions for our family. We created this guide to share the ones we love most — and to give your family a head start on discovering a few of your own.

FUN IN EVERY SEASON

Innisfree was designed for the way our family likes to spend time at the coast: meals outside, evenings around the fire, long conversations beneath the pergola, and a final soak in the hot tub after the beach.

Spring brings flowers. Summer stretches the evenings. Fall brings razor clams and crisp trail rides. Winter delivers dramatic skies, quiet beaches, and some of the year's best sunsets.



WHY WE LOVE SEABROOK



THE BEACH

Miles of broad Pacific shoreline for walking, running, kites, sandcastles, clam digging, and sunset.



DINING

A surprisingly strong collection of bakery, pizza, tavern, wine, coastal, and family dining options.



WALKABILITY

Park the car and explore town, restaurants, shops, parks, pools, and beach access on foot.



HIKING & BIKING

Miles of Seabrook trails plus convenient access to surrounding forest and Buck Lake riding.



FAMILY FRIENDLY

Many playgrounds, pools, the arcade, parks, trails, and room for children of different ages to explore.



PET FRIENDLY

Beaches, trails, patios, and a town that is genuinely fun to explore with a dog.



A PERFECT FIRST WEEKEND

THE FIRST TRIP

FRIDAY

Arrive, walk into town, enjoy dinner, and finish at the bluff for sunset.

SATURDAY

Start with Vista Bakeshop, spend the morning on the beach, ride or hike in the afternoon, enjoy Koko's for dinner, and return to Innisfree for the hot tub or fire pit.

SUNDAY

Take an early beach walk or run, explore the Gnome Trail, enjoy one last meal in town, and stop at the bluff before leaving.

A TRADITION TO BORROW

OUR FAVORITE WAY TO START THE DAY

If you borrow one tradition from our family, make it this one.

Wake up before everyone else, pour a cup of coffee, and head to the beach. Run, walk, or simply take in the quiet. The tide is often low, the sand is nearly empty, and Seabrook feels completely different before the town wakes up.

Our dog, Scout, has joined us for many of these mornings. Follow our favorite route — or choose a running buddy of your own and make it yours.

A TRADITION TO BORROW

Give yourself one quiet morning on the beach before the rest of the day begins.





START HERE

VISTA BAKESHOP

Every trip seems to begin the same way: a walk into town, coffee in hand, and a box of pastries that rarely survives the trip back to the house.

Vista is our favorite way to ease into a Seabrook morning. Go early, enjoy the energy of town waking up, and do not overestimate your family's willingness to share.

Buy one extra pastry.



THE BEACH IS THE PLAN

The beach changes with every tide, every season, and every visit. Some days call for kites and sandcastles. Others are made for long walks, drawings in wet sand, or simply staying until the light begins to change.

SANDCASTLES & SAND ART



Some afternoons are built entirely around one sandcastle. Buckets multiply, plans grow more ambitious, and every wall gets rebuilt at least twice before anyone is satisfied.

Bring real shovels. Ambition grows quickly once the building begins.

A DAY AT THE BEACH

AFTERNOONS MADE FOR KITES



A TRADITION TO BORROW

Bring a kite. The afternoon breeze often arrives right on schedule.



A FAMILY PROJECT

PAINT THEM. PACK THEM. BUILD A VILLAGE.

Before one of our trips, we bought inexpensive paint-your-own gnomes and turned the preparation into an art project. Everyone decorated a few at home before we packed them for Seabrook.

On the Gnome Trail, the kids used bark, sticks, stones, and moss to create tiny villages for them. Then we left a few behind for other families to discover.

The project starts before the trip — and becomes part art project, part forest adventure once you arrive.

A TRADITION TO BORROW

Paint your gnomes before the trip, then let the forest decide where they live.



FAMILY TIME

A PLAYGROUND AROUND EVERY CORNER

One of the reasons Seabrook works so well for extended families is that play spaces are woven throughout town. Different parks appeal to different ages, and discovering the next one can become part of the adventure. Do not stop at the first playground you find — there is always another one worth the walk.



STEPS FROM INNISFREE

PICKLEBALL, JUST STEPS AWAY

The Farm District pickleball courts sit immediately beside Innisfree, making an early match or an evening game one of the easiest activities in the guide.

Bring your paddles and head over whenever the mood strikes. No loading the car. No complicated planning. Just one of the benefits of where Innisfree sits within Seabrook.

OUR FAVORITE POOL IN SEABROOK

When the family wants a pool afternoon, this is the one we choose. The outdoor Sunrise Pool has the atmosphere we love most and makes a great transition between a morning at the beach and an evening back in town.

FUN FOR THE KIDS. SECRETLY FUN FOR THE ADULTS.

The arcade works for younger kids, teenagers, and adults who are more competitive than they care to admit.

It is an easy stop between meals or when everyone needs a change of pace.

FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY

DOGS LOVE SEABROOK, TOO

The wide beach, interconnected trails, walkable streets, outdoor patios, and pet-friendly atmosphere make Seabrook one of our favorite places to bring a dog.

Scout especially loves the early beach walks and forest trails. Your dog will probably develop a favorite route of their own.

Keep an eye out for deer wandering through the quieter parts of town, especially around the Farm District.

MILES OF TRAILS, RIGHT FROM TOWN

One of Seabrook's best features is the network of hiking and mountain-biking trails threaded throughout the property. They connect neighborhoods, forest, parks, and recreation areas — and they are easy to reach without loading bikes into a vehicle.





RIDE STRAIGHT FROM INNISFREE

Start with the trails closest to town, explore as long as the family wants, and return without turning the outing into a major expedition.



EXTENDING THE RIDE

BUCK LAKE & THE DNR TRAILS

For riders who want to extend the adventure, the Buck Lake Trail is an easy, accessible loop that circles the network of more technical downhill trails shown on the DNR map — a great warm-up or cool-down for the whole family.



THE BEST DAY TRIP

LAKE QUINAULT

Home to the World's Largest Sitka Spruce

About an hour from Seabrook, the Lake Quinault area is our favorite day trip beyond town. Ancient forests, waterfalls, the historic lodge, emerald rivers, and one truly enormous tree make it an easy and memorable introduction to the Olympic Peninsula.

THE DIG

Razor clam digging is one of our favorite cold-season Seabrook traditions. Approved digs are commonly scheduled during fall, winter, and spring, when low tides draw families onto the beach with lanterns, clam guns, and buckets.

Always check the current Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife schedule before planning around a dig.

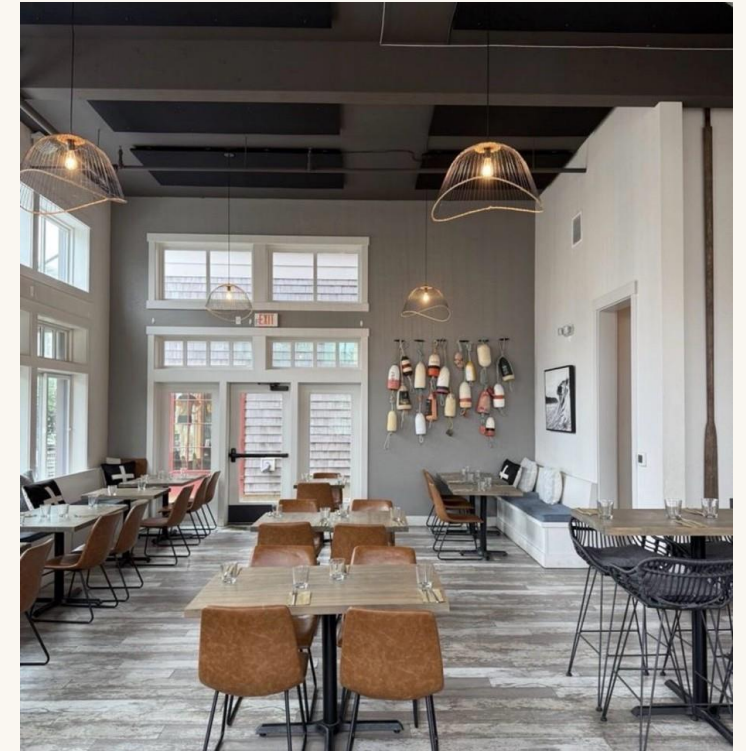

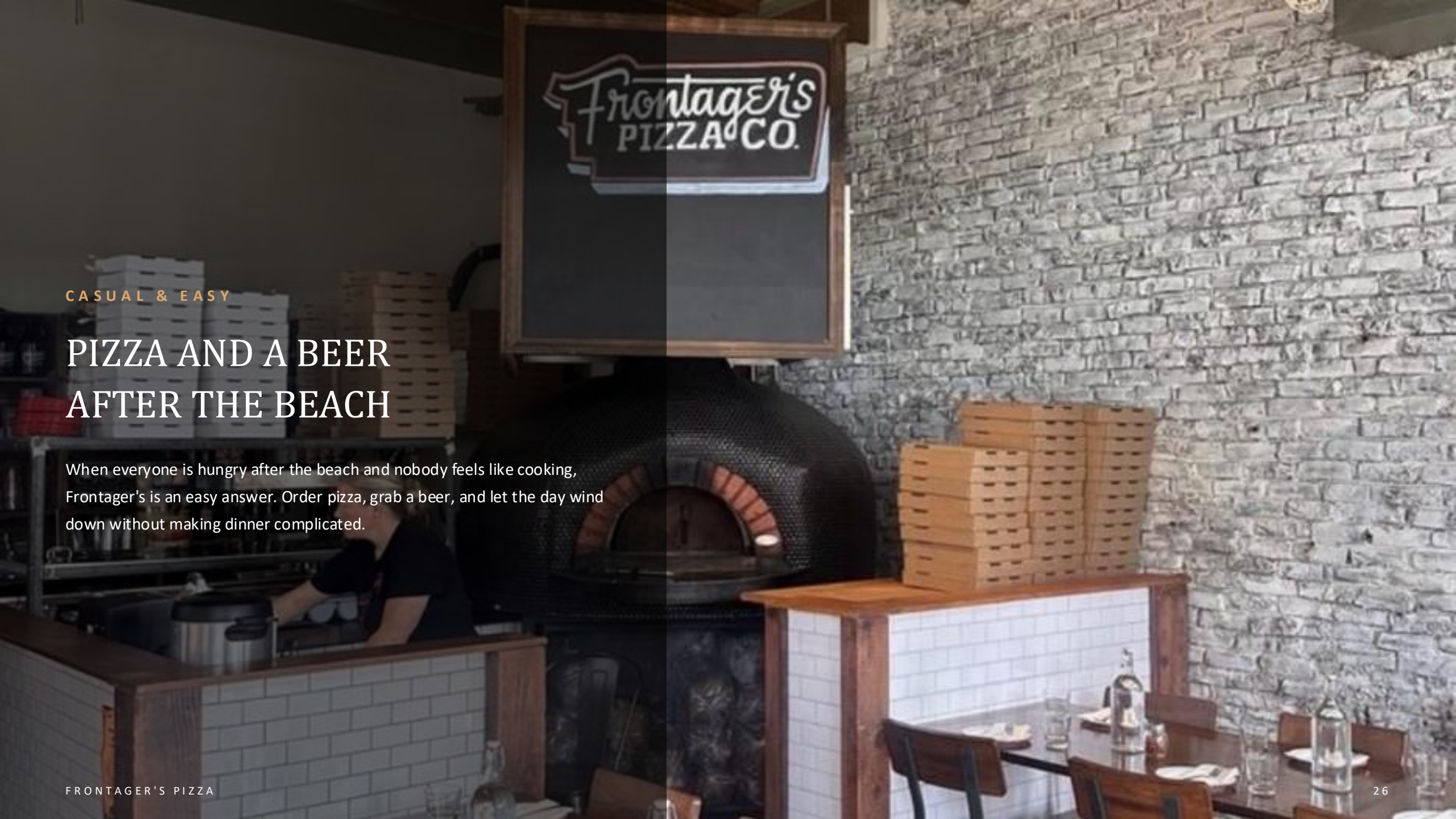

ONE LAST EVENING

THE EVENING DOES NOT HAVE TO END AT SUNSET

Some of our favorite Seabrook evenings continue back at Innisfree — around the fire, beneath the pergola, or in the hot tub after the rest of the day has quieted down.

SEASONAL NOTE

Grays Harbor County or Washington State may impose temporary burn bans during periods of elevated fire danger, particularly in summer. Check current restrictions before using the outdoor fire pit or planning a beach fire.

THE FULL YEAR

SEABROOK THROUGH THE YEAR

Seabrook is enjoyable year-round because the coastal climate is moderate — rarely extremely hot or extremely cold.

Flowers, mild days, trails, and quieter beaches.



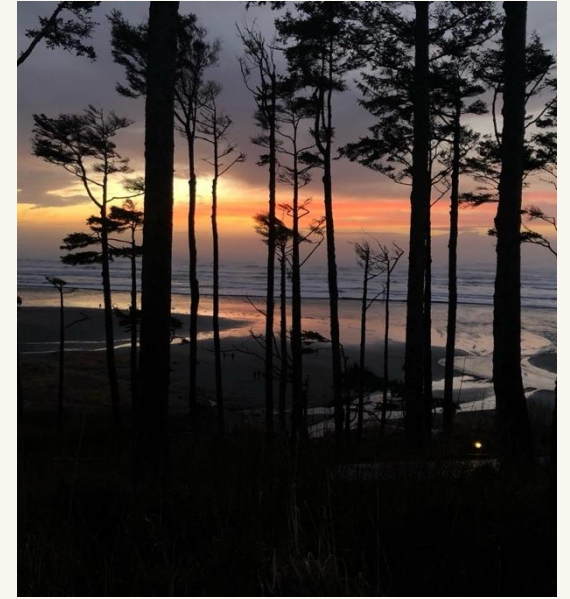
SUMMER
