# Graveyard Pete & The New Appalachian Sound Win ISSA Band of the Year!



ATLANTA — Independent roots outfit Graveyard Pete & The New Appalachian Sound captured the Bronze Award for USA Band of the Year at the 2025 International Singer-Songwriters Association (ISSA) Awards on Saturday, August 23, at the Byers Theatre in the Sandy Springs Performing Arts Center. The band celebrated the result shortly after the show, posting "2025 Bronze Band of the Year... We got one, baby!" and thanking the ISSA team and supporters.

This year's ceremony brought finalists from around the globe to metro Atlanta; ISSA confirmed the red-carpet schedule and start time for the event, which capped a weekend of activities including the Summit, a pre-party in Alpharetta and an after-party following the awards. Graveyard Pete & The New Appalachian Sound entered awards weekend after being named an official 2025 finalist by ISSA in multiple categories, including Band of the Year—part of a field whittled down from tens of thousands of fan votes before final judging by prior gold-level winners.

They released their debut LP Castles in the Sand in June and appeared live on WCBE 90.5 FM's "Live From Studio A" ahead of their albumrelease show at Eldorado's. The group describes its sound as an award-winning blend of folk, rock, blues, and Appalachian roots—an approach that's also garnered recognition from organizations like the World Songwriting Awards and the Josie Music Awards.

ISSA, founded to spotlight independent artists, stages its annual awards each August in the Atlanta area and recognizes winners in gold, silver, and bronze tiers across U.S. and international divisions. (The association published full winners lists for prior years and scheduled this year's show for August 23.)

With the Bronze now in hand, Graveyard Pete & The New Appalachian Sound turn back to a slate of Ohio shows this fall as momentum for Castles in the Sand continues.

Thank you for giving so many voices a stage and for creating memories that will last a lifetime.




