Scheduled for 1:50 PM on the Bozo Stage, the band took part in the vibrant celebration of arts and activism running from June 27-29 .

Fronted by Aaron DeYarmon (lead vocals, rhythm guitar), the group brought their high energy on stage: Will Christoffersen (lead guitar, backing vocals), Lynde Wangler (violin/fiddle), Michael Ulery (bass), with Rufus Wilson Jr. sitting in on drums, rounding out their rich folk-rock sound.

Their set included selections from their debut album Castles in the Sand, notably "Counting on You" and "No Flags", blending Appalachian storytelling with modern energy. The live performance underscored their deep roots in Columbus's music scene and showcased why they've been turning heads locally and regionally.

Following their set, the band connected with fans and fellow performers throughout the festival grounds, waving through local media and social platforms. Their ComFest appearance further cements their reputation as one of Columbus's most compelling and community-driven acts.

With momentum building from both festival stages and industry recognition, Graveyard Pete & The New Appalachian Sound continue to rise — turning everyday stories into stirring songs and proving their sound resonates far beyond local borders.









Frontman and songwriter Aaron DeYarmon led the group on vocals and rhythm guitar, joined by Will Christoffersen (lead guitar and background vocals), Lynde Wangler (fiddle), Michael Ulery (bass) and for this special session, drummer Scott Connors sat in with the band, providing the rhythmic backbone that gave the live tracks their unmistakable drive and energy.

Following the set, the band joined Taylor for a brief interview, discussing the creative process behind Castles in the Sand and the stories behind tracks like "Counting on You" and "No Flags." The album, already gaining traction across folk and indie charts, has also earned the band six nominations for the International Singer Songwriters Association (ISSA) Awards, including Band of the Year, Album of the Year, and multiple honors for DeYarmon as Songwriter, Musician, and Male Vocalist of the Year.

Graveyard Pete & The New Appalachian Sound also announced their current For Your Consideration (FYC) campaign for a potential Grammy nomination in the Folk category, further establishing themselves as serious contenders in the national music scene.
